My fieldwork

\What was my research question?

→How much is the parking lot for bicycles filled? How has the presence of bicycles been addressed in urban development?

Why is this important to me?

→I've been riding my bicycle from a young ages and using it as a way of transportation. My cities implemented paid parking a few years ago but the problem of being overcrowded is still unchanged. I want to look into the problem and find a clue to it.

What did I do?


• Urban Bicycle Parking 1 (Kurogane-Cho Higashi Bicycle Parking, north exit of Shizuoka Sta.)

Paid Parking or Free Parking for each cities?(near station)

- Mishima Station→Mostly Paid(¥ 100 for a day)
- Numazu Station→Mostly Free
- Fuji/Yoshiwara Station(Fuji City)→Mostly Free
- Shin-Kambara Station→Free
- •Kusanagi Station→Both Paid or Free(daily or monthly subscription for paid ones)
- -Shizuoka Station→Both Paid or Free(daily or monthly subscription for paid ones)

What trends did I find in the data?

- •Regardless of whether it is an Urban, Suburban or Rural area, it looks like most of the parkings are saturated.
 - →It is presumed that the total floor area and number of bicycle parking facilities differ according to local demand. However, due to considerations such as profitability, there may be a tendency to deliberately underprovide these facilities across regions in order to reduce vacancy rates.

- The results indicate that the proportion of paid bicycle parking facilities tends to be higher in more urbanized areas.
- →Could this be related to land prices? Or perhaps to management costs such as labor expenses?

How does my fieldwork connect to my future?

Through this survey, I was able to gain a clearer understanding of the development of bicycle transportation in Shizuoka. Japan is considered a major bicycle-oriented country, with 68 bicycles per 100 people—a figure that ranks among the highest globally. However, the findings raise questions about whether sufficient infrastructure has been put in place to support this high level of ownership.

Although no critical issues have surfaced with regard to bicycle parking facilities, there were instances—particularly during peak hours—when available space was lacking, giving the impression of limited redundancy. Beyond parking, concerns were also raised about road width; due to inherently narrow roads, it is often difficult to establish dedicated bicycle lanes.

As a mode of transportation, bicycles occupy a unique position—they can be both victims and perpetrators in traffic accidents. Yet, from the perspective of environmental sustainability, they are highly eco-friendly. Therefore, in order to promote wider adoption, it is hoped that safer and more comfortable environments for cyclists will be developed.
