Miss Ross's first graders turned into junior engineers this past Friday! We were so excited to welcome our Elementary Tech Specialist, **Mrs. Judy Keller**, to our classroom for a high-speed math adventure. Our students had to think like programmers to get their cars from point A to point B. Students worked as a team to solve puzzles.



First graders are having fun exploring measurement in math by using both centimeter cubes and rulers to find the length of objects around the room. This hands-on approach allows them to master the concept of centimeters while turning math practice into a fun and interactive discovery process.

First Grade has been learning about Earth science, specifically the phases of the moon and how the Earth's position impacts our seasons. We have also been exploring why the days get longer and shorter, and how this relates to Daylight Saving Time. Did you know the sun is actually a star made of burning hot gases?



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

### What are we Learning?

# *Fourth Graders Become Stream Scientists*

On Thursday 10/16/25, four classrooms of enthusiastic fourth-grade students from Hambright Elementary School recently transformed into budding scientists as they embarked on a thrilling stream study. Armed with nets, magnifying glasses, and a thirst for knowledge, the young explorers ventured into the nearby creek to investigate its aquatic ecosystem.

The students, under the guidance of their dedicated teachers, Mrs. Groff, Ms. Gaston, Mrs. Hufford, and Mr. Showalter, learned about the importance of streams in our environment. They discovered how streams provide habitats for various creatures, filter water, and play a crucial role in the water cycle.

During the stream study, the students collected water samples, observed aquatic macroinvertebrates, and identified different types of plants and animals living in the stream. They also measured water temperature, pH levels as well as nitrates, phosphates, and dissolved oxygen. Through these hands-on activities, the young scientists gained a deeper understanding of the delicate balance of the stream ecosystem.

"Our stream study was so much fun . . . and a little cold!" wrote an unnamed fourth-grader. "We learned so much about the macroinvertebrates that live in the water and how important it is to protect our waterways."

Hambright 4th grade plans to continue incorporating outdoor learning experiences into its curriculum, fostering a love for nature and scientific inquiry among its students.



Taking the bus for the first time is a big step for your child. Help your kids get a gold star in bus safety by following these tips.

- Walk with your kids to the bus stop and wait with them until it arrives. Tell kids to stand at least three giant steps back from the curb as the bus approaches and board the bus one at a time.
- Teach kids to wait for the bus to come to a complete stop before getting off and never to walk behind the bus.
- If your child needs to cross the street after exiting the bus, he or she should take five giant steps in front of the bus, make eye contact with the bus driver and cross when the driver indicates it's safe. Teach kids to look left, right and left again before crossing the street.
- Instruct younger kids to use handrails when boarding or exiting the bus. Be careful of straps or drawstrings that could get caught in the door. If your children drop something, they should tell the bus driver and make sure the bus driver is able to see them before they pick it up.
- Drivers should always follow the speed limit and slow down in school zones and near bus stops. Remember to stay alert and look for kids who may be trying to get to or from the school bus.
- Slow down and stop if you're driving near a school bus that is flashing yellow or red lights. This means the bus is either preparing to stop (yellow) or already stopped (red), and children are getting on or off.



*School buses are the safest mode of motorized transportation for getting children to and from school, but injuries can occur if kids are not careful and aware when getting on and off the bus.*


### ***Applied Engineering with Mr. Andrew***




