Dear Students of 9th Grade,

In the article, 'Bullying Statistics', it states that "...about one in four kids in the U.S. are bullied on a regular basis. Between cyberbullying and bullying at school, the school bullying statistics illustrate a huge problem with bullying and the American school system." Although this isn't a problem that is too out of hand yet here at Point Loma High, we still have to monitor what can and will happen if we completely ignore it and let it run rampant. I'm talking about bullying, someone using their superior strength or influence to intimidate another, typically to force him or her to do what they want, such as making them do their homework, give them money, and basically giving them a rough time just because they can. . At Point Loma High School, i have personally seen the effects of what bullying can do to a person, and i have suffered some of these effects myself. In the article Effects of Bullying, it states that "kids who are bullied can experience negative physical, school, and mental health issues [such as] depression...anxiety..and increased feelings of sadness and loneliness." People are affected by bullying because According to a 2013 article in Forbes Magazine "the psychological effects of being bullied can and do stay with people for a long time." Studies have also shown that those who have been bullied are more susceptible to committing suicide, "...bully victims are between 2 to 9 times more likely to consider suicide than non-victims..." Bullying is something that divides us, it puts youths and

teens against each other, and that isn't a real way to live to the fullest you can be. We go to school each day to learn how to be better students and how to interact with those around us and if we are always at each other's throats, then where does that lead? Sometimes to suicide, sometimes to depression, and sometimes to seclusion.

Students get bullied for a whole myriad of reasons. According to a survey that i made for the freshman class here at PLHS, the main reason for a student to get bullied was because of their appearance, their opinions, and their sexual identity. In the article, "Why Do People Bully?", author Kayla C. tells us that "...bullies usually only bully around other people. They always have to have an audience. This makes the bully feel more popular and cool. If no one cared for bullying and was against it there would be way less bullying..." In other words, bullies do it for the attention, and to make themselves feel better. Others bully because they feel miserable and they think that if they bully others and make them feel the same way that they will somehow feel better. However, others still bully because they see it at home and then they get the idea that bullying is okay, since they saw older siblings and parents hurting others. This goes to show that home life is more intertwined with bullying than meets the eye.

Bullying is something that has to be stopped, or at the very least acknowledged as a problem, so people can start taking the necessary steps to discourage and get rid of it. Relating back to the survey that i made for the freshmen here at PLHS, the results suggested that we are not as accepting of differences than i think we should be. I'm suggesting that the teachers here take the time to explain about once every other month what bullying is, how it affects not just those getting bullied, but the community as a whole. I also think that an anti-bullying club or a program would richly benefit the student here at PLHS. To think that we can save a life by just stopping a bully is a big deal. In the article 'How To Stop Bullying At School' some suggestions were to "...let bullies know that you do not think being mean is cool, see if you can start an anti-bullying club or prevention program at your school," and that it is wrong and should never be used against anyone for any reason. If we can control the bullying epidemic we can essentially save lives. So let us work together and stop bullying before it stops a heart.
