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Grade Level News

Kindergarten

Language Arts:

Students will be reading, “Bug and Cat” and “Fun, Fun, Fun”. They will be reviewing letter the “Uu” sound.

Math:

Into Math Module 17

First Grade

Language Arts:

Students will be reading the story, “Little Rabbit’s Tale”. Students will be studying glued sounds and r-controlled vowels.

Math:

Into Math Module 11: Understanding greater than and less than and using symbols to compare numbers.

Second Grade

Language Arts:

Students will be reading, “Gloria Who Might Be My Best Friend” and focusing on adjectives, homophones, and words with “y”.

Math:

Into Math Module 13: Develop addition and subtraction fluency.

Third Grade

Language Arts:

Mrs. Fischer’s room will be reading, “Jake Drake Know It All”. Mrs. Smith’s class will be reading, “Judy Moody was in the Mood”.

Miss Row’s class will be working on comprehension skills while reading and comparing passages. They will also be working on test taking skills to prepare for the state test.

Programs in the Building

What is B.L.U.E?

B.L.U.E. stands for Behavior Leading Us to Excellence.

Every nine weeks, students have a chance to earn blue bucks from their classroom teacher. They earn these with good acts of behavior.

At the end of every nine weeks, if a student meets the required amount of blue bucks they will earn a nine weeks reward.

B.L.U.E. is our PBIS program, which stands for Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports.

Below are the three tiers of behavior interventions of PBIS. Students that do not meet our nine weeks reward will receive a tier 2 small group intervention. Tier 3 is used for individual students.

Tier 1: Universal Prevention (All)-PAX

Tier 1 supports serve as the foundation for behavior and academics. Schools provide these universal supports to all students. For most students, the core program gives them what they need to be successful and to prevent future problems.

Tier 2: Targeted Prevention

This level of support focuses on improving specific skill deficits students have. Schools often provide Tier 2 supports to groups of students with similar targeted needs.

Tier 3: Intensive, Individualized Prevention

Tier 3 supports are the most intensive supports the school offers. These supports are the most resource intensive due to the individualized approach of developing and carrying out interventions.

PAX

Each teacher has been trained to implement this program in their classrooms. PAX is used to increase self-regulation, group regulation, and increase positive behavior amongst students and reduce negative behavior.
