

Stream Zoom Meetings on YouTube Live

You are able to livestream your Zoom meetings on YouTube to an audience that isn't participating in your meeting. When streaming a meeting to YouTube, users will only be able to interact with other users on the same platform: Zoom users with Zoom users and YouTube users with YouTube users. During the live event, there will be an approximate 20-second delay between the actual Zoom Meeting and the live stream. NOTE: Please plan ahead, as part of the live streaming setup takes at least 24 hours to complete!

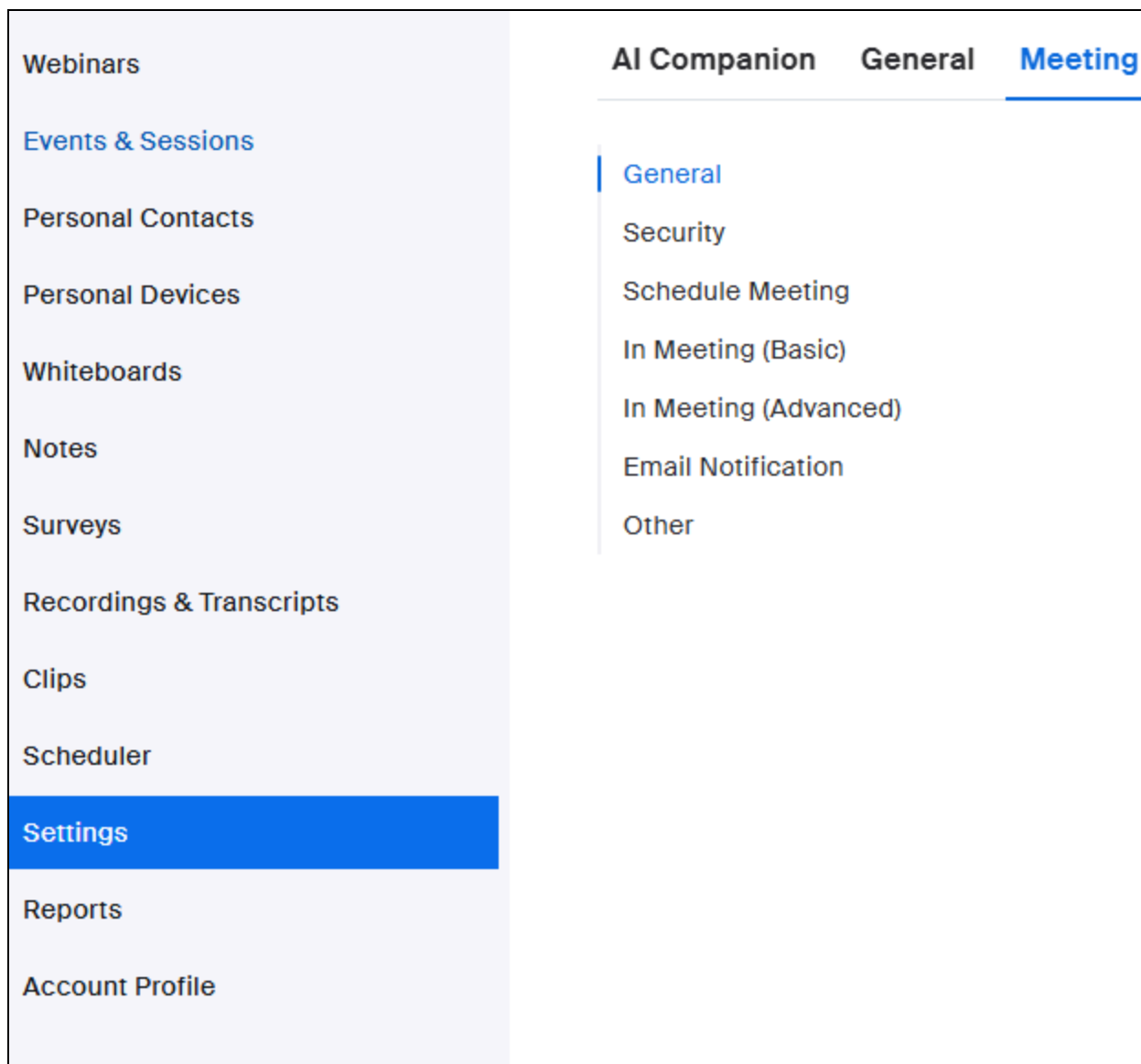
Why Live Streaming?

Live streaming your Zoom Meetings to YouTube Live is best suited to scenarios where a meeting host and possibly panelists interact with one another over Zoom, while viewers watch and only interact with other viewers on YouTube. Some events like this might include:

- Webinars
- Department or school-wide events
- Community events with a significant non-OU audience
- Online classes with an audience outside of the class
- Events with audiences over 300 people

Enable YouTube Live Streaming for Meetings in Zoom

1. Sign in to oakland-edu.zoom.us with your OU NetID.
2. Click the **Settings** tab in the left sidebar.



3. Under the Meeting tab, scroll to the **In Meeting (Advanced)** section.
4. Toggle on **Allow live streaming meetings**.



5. Check the box for **YouTube** if it is not already enabled.
6. Click **Save**.

Enable Live Streaming for Your YouTube Account

If you have never done a livestream through the YouTube account connected to your OU email, you will need to enable live streaming on your OU YouTube account. This process will need to be done **at least 24 hours** before the meeting you want to live stream, because any YouTube account takes 24 hours to activate for live streaming. To do this, follow the steps below:

1. Sign in to your OU webmail account with your Net ID and access your YouTube account via the Google Apps icon in the upper right-hand corner next to Support and Settings.



NOTE: You can also log in to your department's shared OU email account and enable streaming to a shared YouTube channel with these same steps.

2. Open your [YouTube channel settings](#) in YouTube Studio.
 - a. Click the link or go to YouTube and click your profile picture.
 - b. Select Your channel in the drop down menu.
 - c. Click Manage Videos in the upper right corner.
 - d. Click on Settings in the left sidebar.
 - e. Select Channel.
 - f. Locate Feature eligibility..
3. Under **Feature Eligibility**, if **Features that require phone verification** is not enabled, you will need to verify your phone number on your YouTube channel in order to enable live streaming.

5. In the new window, select your country and the method you want to receive the verification code, enter your phone number, and then click **Submit**.

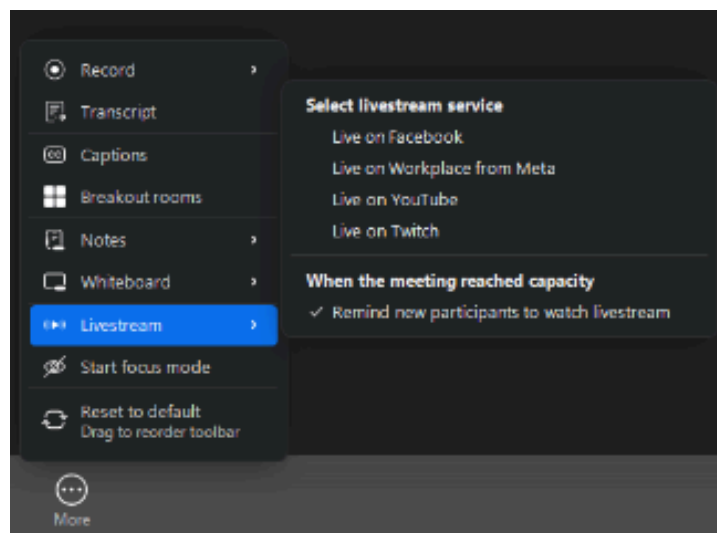
7. You should see a confirmation that your account has been verified.

Initiating a Livestream During a Meeting

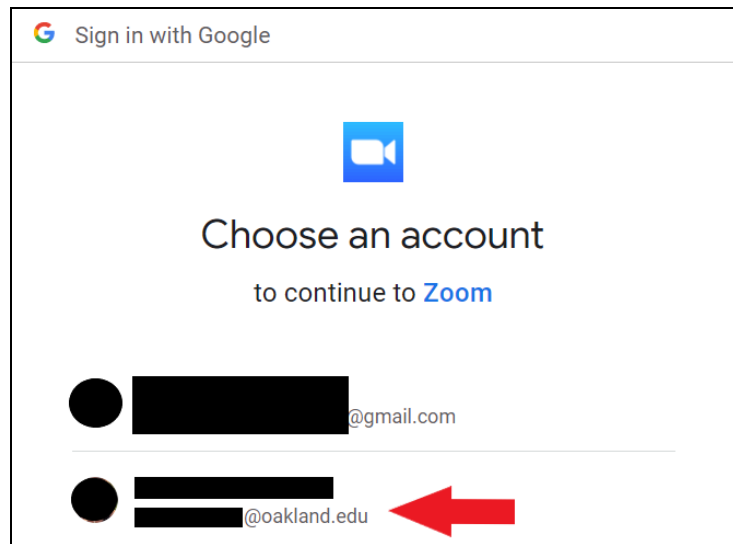
[Direct Streaming](#) From a Meeting

This works well if you want to spontaneously livestream a meeting.

1. Start the meeting.
2. Click **More** in the Meeting Controls.
3. Click **Live on YouTube**.



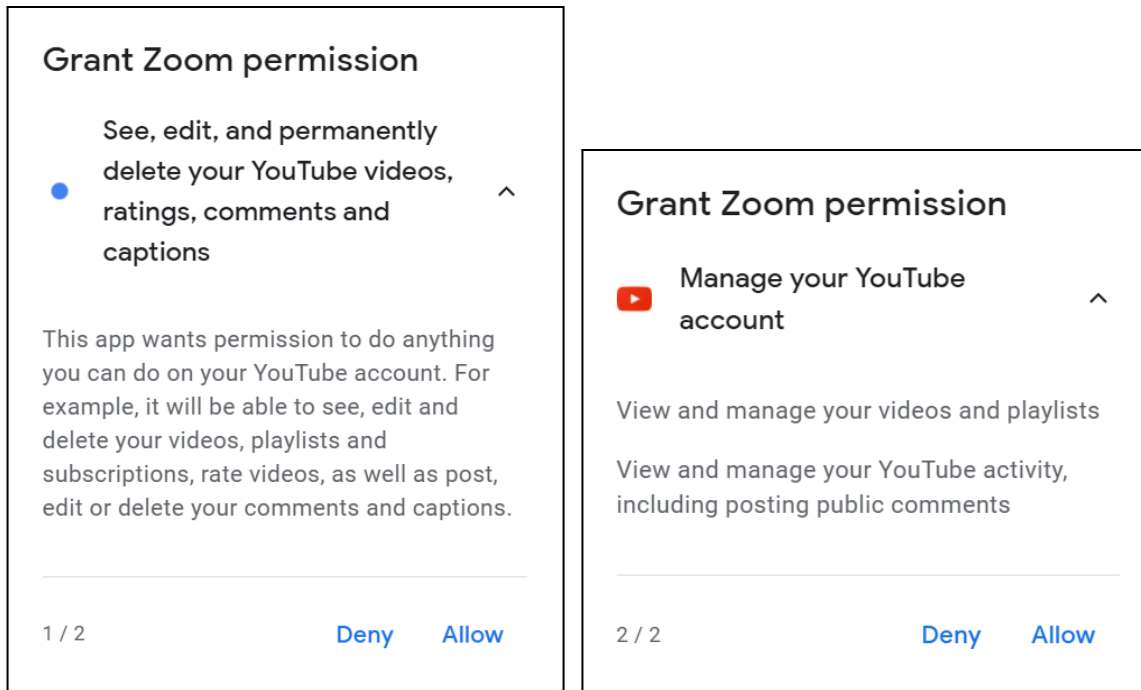
4. A browser window will open and prompt you to select a Google account with which to log in to YouTube. Select your OU Google account.



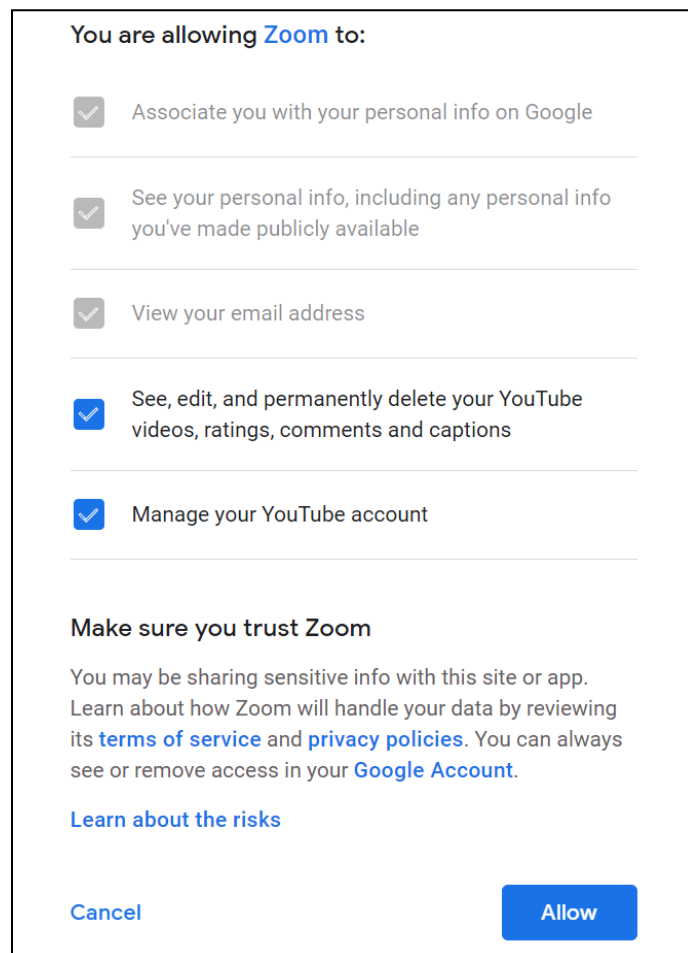
- a. A notice will appear beneath your accounts: “To continue, Google will share your name, email address, language preference, and profile picture with Zoom. Before using this app, you can review Zoom's [privacy policy](#) and [terms of service](#).”

5. You may be prompted to log in with your OU NetID.

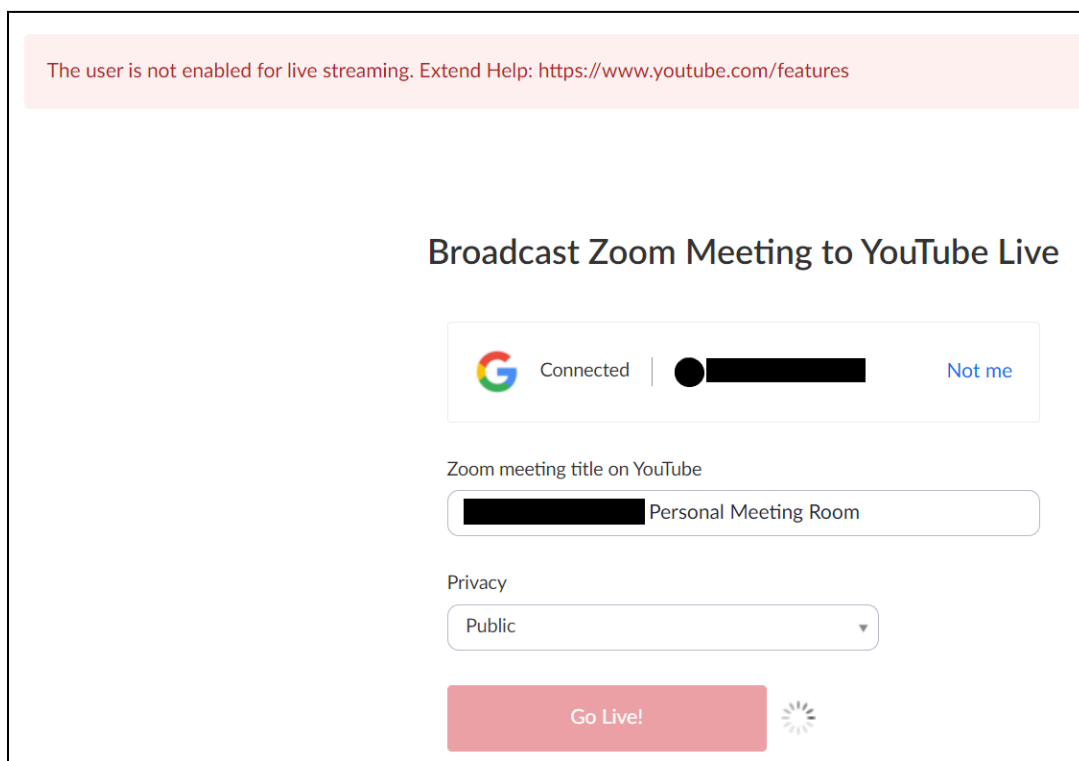
6. If this is your first time live streaming, you will then be asked to grant Zoom permissions. If you accept these permissions, click **Allow**.



7. You will be asked to confirm your permission choices. If you accept these permissions, click **Allow**.



- a. A notice will read: “You may be sharing sensitive info with this site or app. Learn about how Zoom will handle your data by reviewing its [terms of service](#) and [privacy policies](#). You can always see or remove access in your [Google Account](#). [Learn about the risks](#).”
8. The next page will say “Broadcast Zoom Meeting to YouTube Live.”
- a. If you see the notice “The user is not enabled for lives treaming,” make sure you have followed the instructions to [enable live streaming for your YouTube account](#).

9. Once your account has been enabled for livestreaming, on the page that says “Broadcast Zoom Meeting to YouTube Live,” the Go Live button should appear lit up. On this page, you can edit your Zoom meeting title on YouTube and the privacy settings for the livestream.
- a. The title will automatically match the name of your meeting, but you can edit it to say whatever you want to appear on YouTube.
 - b. We recommend setting the privacy setting to **Unlisted** if you only want people with the link to view the livestream.

10. Click **Go Live!**

11. Zoom will notify you when your livestream has started. Once it has started, you can continue your meeting/livestream as planned.

NOTE: During the live event, there will be an approximate 20-second delay between the actual Zoom Meeting and the live stream.

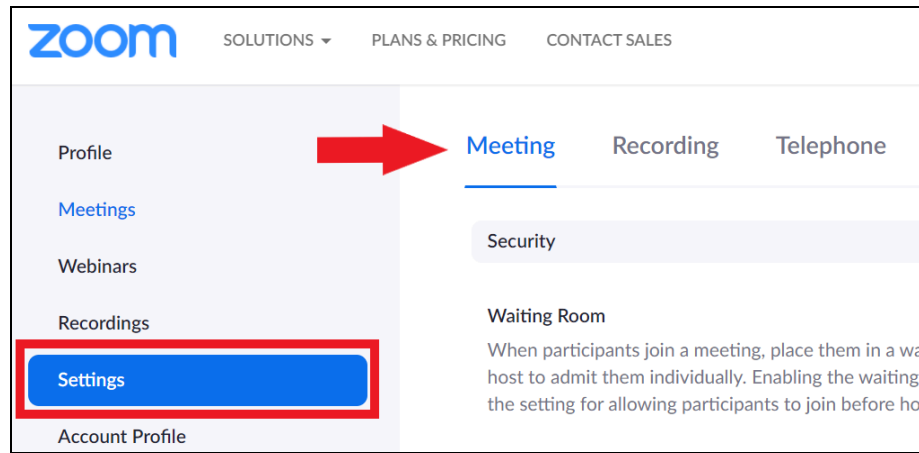
12. To end the livestream, click **End** and then **End Meeting for All**, or click **More** and then **Stop Live Stream** if you want to continue the meeting but not the livestream.

Enable **Custom Live Streaming Service** in your Zoom account

1. Sign in to oakland-edu.zoom.us with your OU NetID.
2. Click the **Settings** tab in the left sidebar.



3. Under the Meeting tab, scroll to the **In Meeting (Advanced)** section.
4. Under **Allow live streaming meetings**, check the box for **Custom Live Streaming Service** if it is not already enabled.

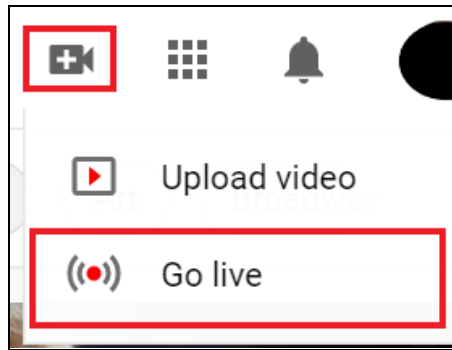

5. Click **Save**.

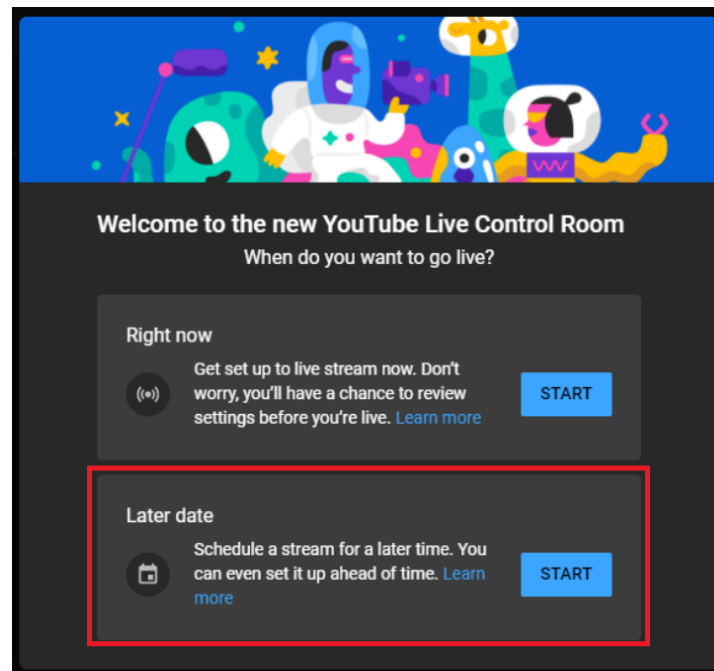
Create Your First YouTube Livestream

Follow these steps the first time you schedule a YouTube livestream event. If this is not your first YouTube livestream, skip ahead to the [next section](#).

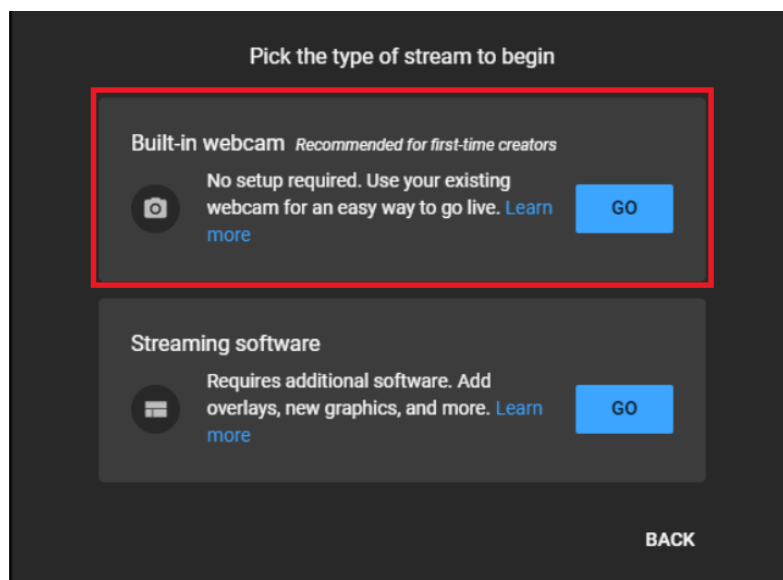
1. Navigate to your YouTube account. Click the **Create** icon, then click **Go Live**.



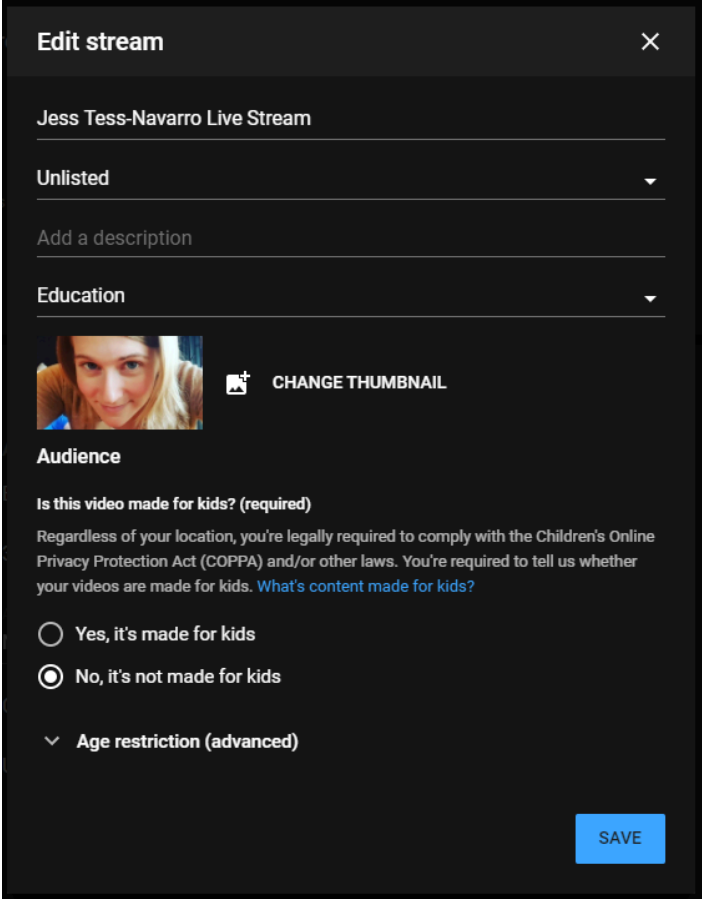
2. You will be prompted to choose whether to go live right now or at a later date. Click **Later date** and **Start**.



3. Pick the type of stream to begin. Click **Built-in webcam** and **Go**.



4. A popup window will appear stating that studio.youtube.com wants to use your microphone and camera. Click **Allow**.
5. Select the **Stream** tab.
6. Create the Event by selecting or inputting the event details, including title, privacy, category, thumbnail, and audience (is this video made for kids). Click **Save**.

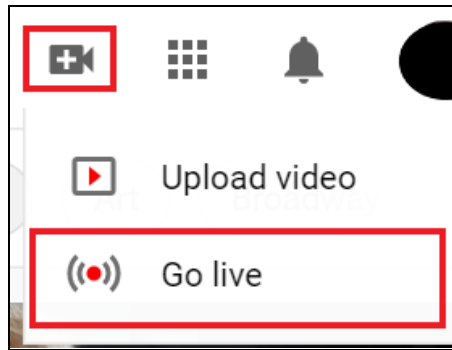

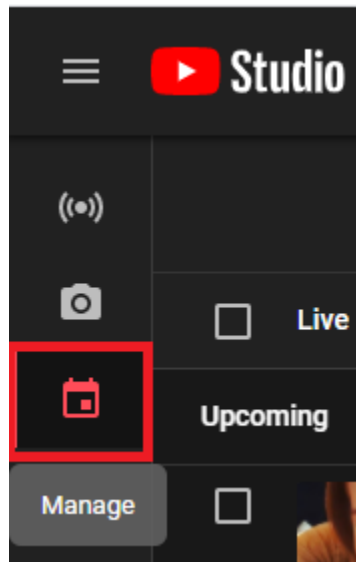
Create Additional YouTube Livestreams

Follow these steps to schedule a YouTube livestream AFTER your first time:

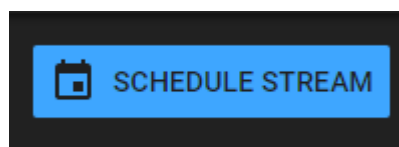
1. Navigate to your YouTube account. Click the **Create** icon, then click **Go Live**.



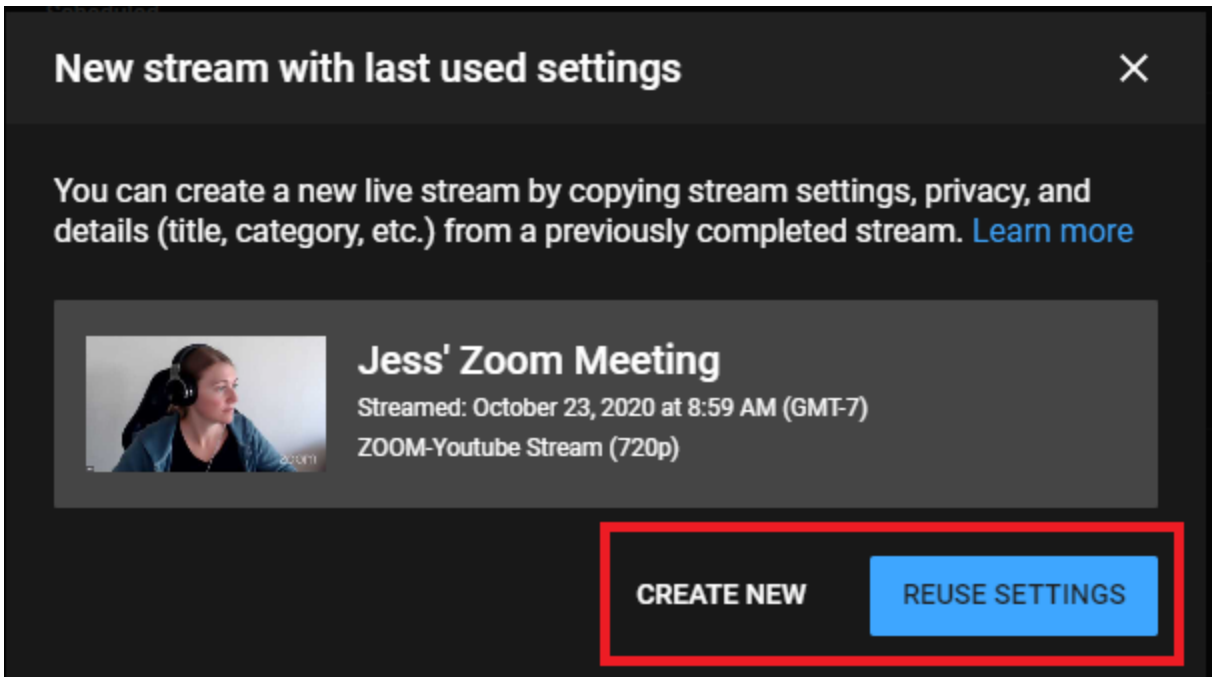
2. Select the **Manage** tab from the top left hand menu.



3. Click the blue **Schedule Stream button** in the top right corner.



4. A pop-up window will appear, allowing you to choose new settings by clicking the **Create New button**, OR to create a new live stream with your settings from a previous live stream by clicking the blue **Reuse Settings button**.



5. Either way, you will be able to confirm the settings in the New stream pop-up window. After reviewing, click the **Create button**.

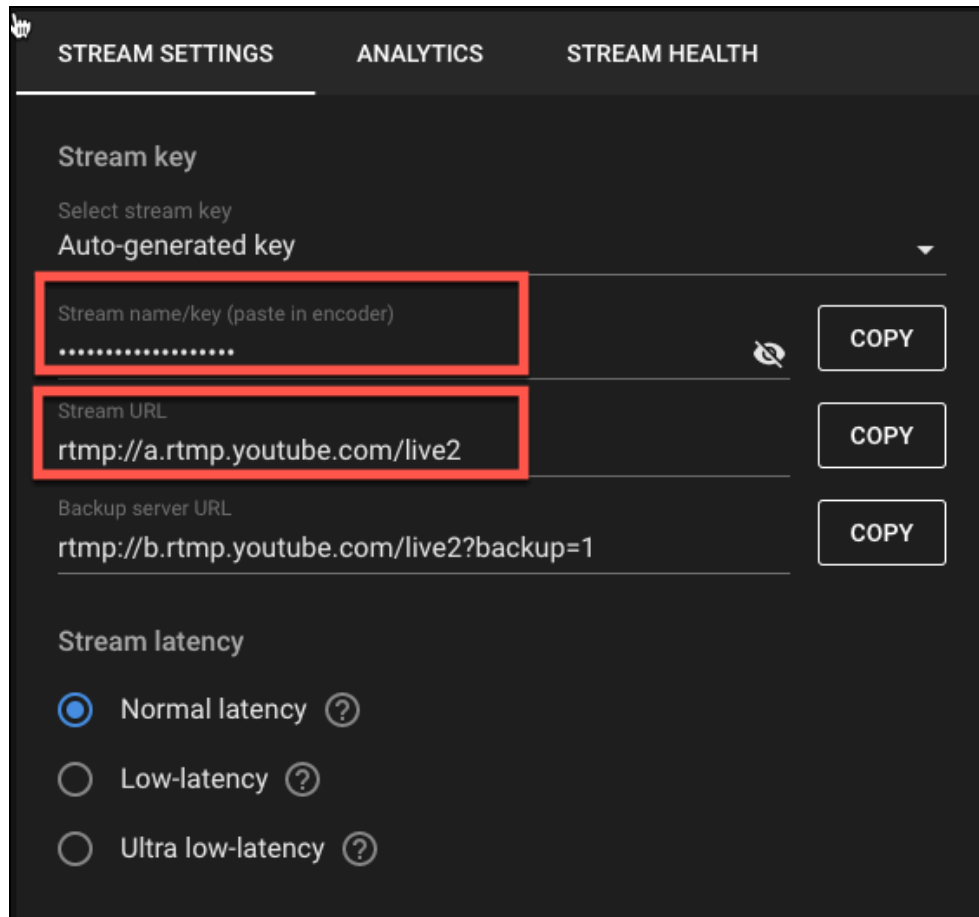

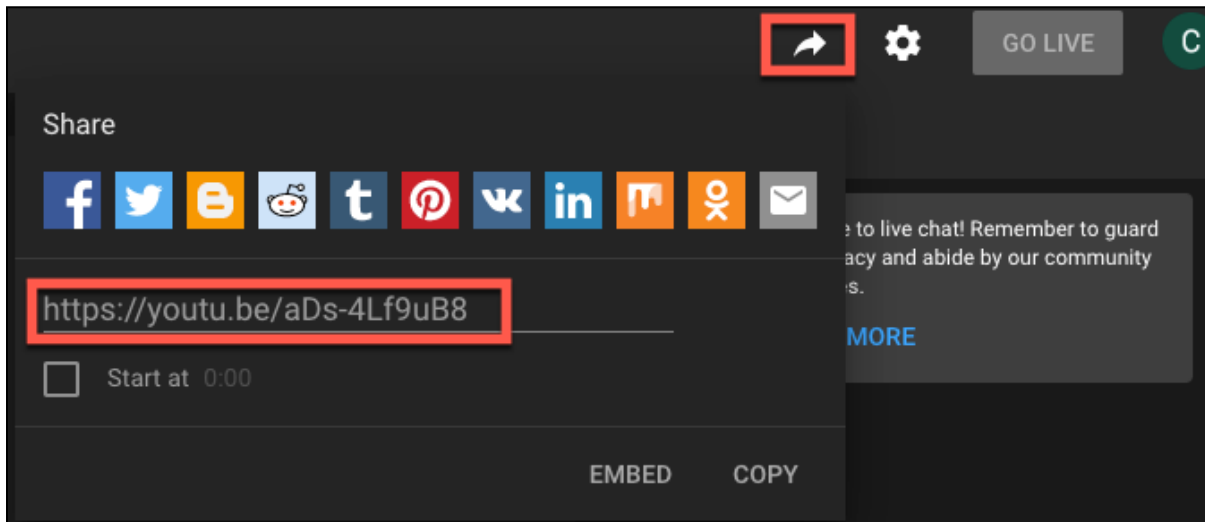

Add Live Stream Details to Zoom Event

1. Select the **Stream tab** from the top left hand menu.
2. Copy the live stream details, including Stream URL, Stream key, and Live streaming page URL.



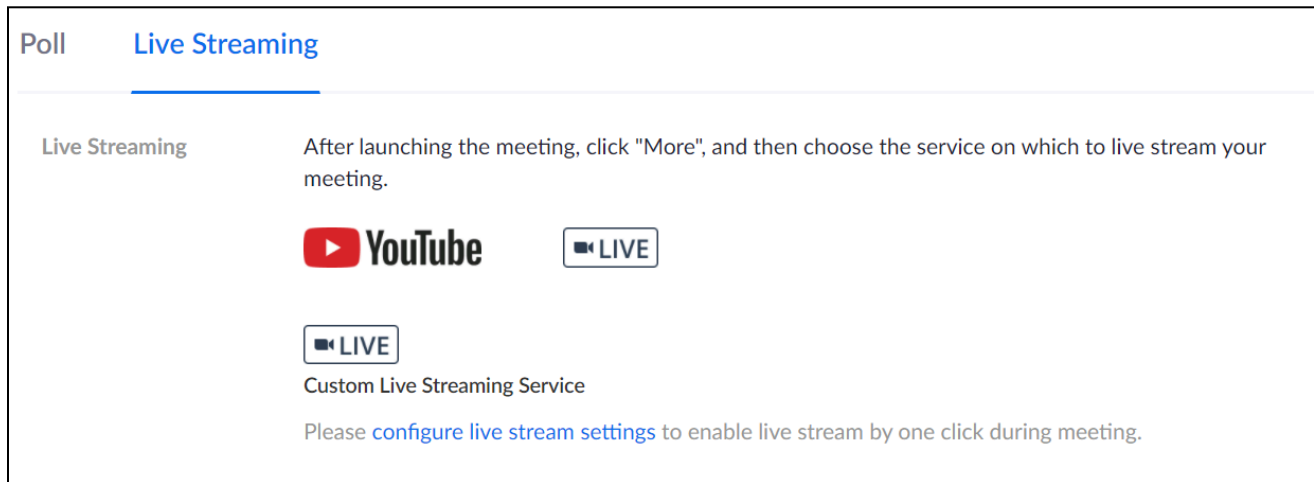
NOTE: The Live Streaming page URL can be found by clicking the share arrow in the YouTube Event, and copying the link there.



3. Create a Zoom meeting and add the custom livestream details.

- On oakland-edu.zoom.us, click the **Meetings** tab in the left sidebar.
- Schedule your meeting with the necessary details (date, time, title) and click **Save**.

- c. Scroll to the bottom of the meeting details and click the **Live Streaming** tab, then click **configure live stream settings**.

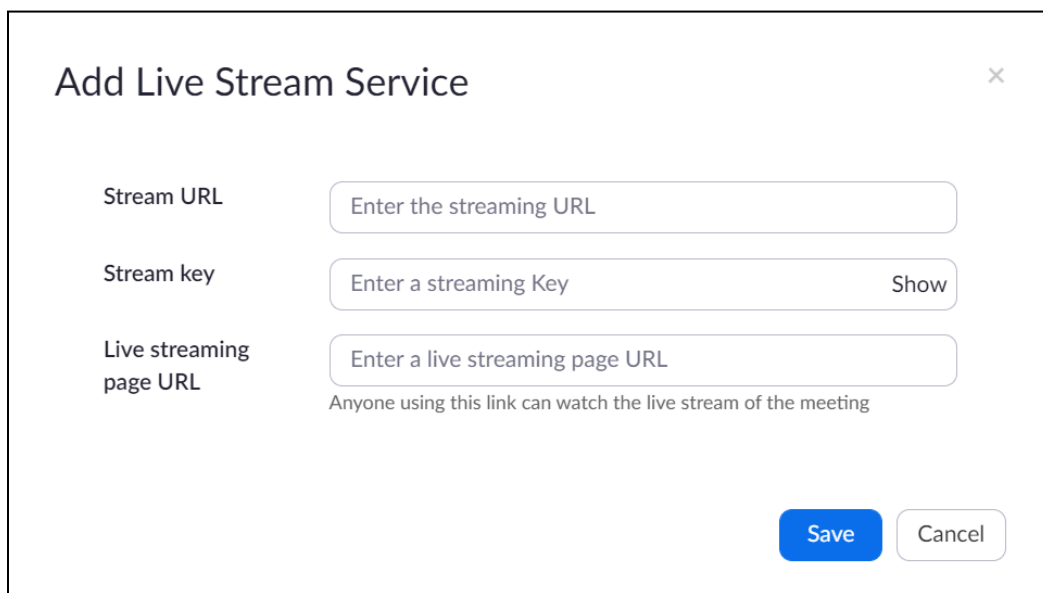

- d. Paste the Stream URL, Stream key, and Live streaming page URL details from your YouTube event, then click **Save**.

4. Start your Zoom meeting.
5. Click **More** in the Meeting Controls, then **Live on Custom Live Streaming Service**.
6. In the YouTube Studio Dashboard, click **Go Live**.

NOTE: During the live event, there will be an approximate 20-second delay between the actual Zoom Meeting and the live stream.

7. To end the livestream, click **End** and then **End Meeting for All**, or click **More** and then **Stop Live Stream** if you want to continue the meeting but not the livestream.
