

EXEMPTIONS FROM REQUIRED INSTRUCTION

If the religious belief and teachings of a student or his parents or legal guardian are contrary to the content of a school subject, or to any part of a school activity, the student may be exempt from participation. To receive such an exemption the parent or legal guardian must present a written request for exemption to the school principal, stating the conflict involved. Alternative learning opportunities may be assigned to assure that students will meet District and course standards.

If a student is unable to participate in a physical education class he must present to the school principal a statement from a physician stating the reason for his inability to participate.

Exemptions from required instruction do not excuse a pupil from the total semester hours required for graduation or from meeting District and course standards.
