Despite having 14 million Powered Two Wheelers, Taiwan does not include lane filtering in its traffic laws. Lane filtering refers to the act of PTWs sharing the same lane or moving between two lanes in slow or static traffic in the same direction. This lack of regulation leads to widespread confusion about the practice among road users in Taiwan, dangerous maneuvers, and inefficient filtering behaviors on roads.
