District & Claremont Scholarships Handbook

Every year, Claremont grads have access to approximately \$90,000 in scholarships to be used towards post-secondary education. There are scholarships that recognize students for excellence:

- Academics
- Applied Skills
- Athletics
- Community service
- Environmental Stewardship
- Fine Arts
- Languages
- Leadership
- Trades

Eligibility:

- Applicants must be graduating from Claremont in June 2026.
- Some scholarships require applicants to be Canadian citizens. If the criteria does not specify citizenship or does not require a Social Insurance Number (SIN), then it is open to all, including international students.
- Students may apply for as many scholarships as they see fit.

What is the difference between a District Scholarship and a Claremont Scholarship?

District Scholarships

- All students in the Saanich School District (Claremont, Stelly's, Parkland, ILC and SIDES) can apply for **district scholarships**. The decisions will be made by committees formed at the SD63 board office.
- **New This Year:** Application packages for district scholarships must be printed out and submitted to Ms. Tong (room 323) before the deadline. Applications will not be accepted by email.

Claremont-based Scholarships

- Only Claremont students can apply for these scholarships. The decisions will be made by committees formed by Claremont staff members.
- Application for Claremont-based scholarships must be submitted online in the application portal located in the Claremont Scholarships Website

How Will I know if I am a Successful Applicant?

Scholarships will be awarded at the Awards Ceremony in June. All successful applicants will receive an email in early June along with an invitation to the Awards Ceremony.

Community-based scholarships require students to apply directly to the organization sponsoring the scholarships.

What About Entrance Scholarships at Specific Universities?

Each university has its own criteria for entrance scholarships. Some do not require applications and others do. To find out, go to a university's website and use the following search terms:

Can International Students Apply for Scholarships?

Most scholarships require applicants to have a social insurance number. International students can apply for any of the Claremont PAC scholarships, the Saanich-Gulf Islands Green Party scholarship and the Rotary Club scholarships.

District Scholarship Requirements

Eligible students across the Saanich School District will be competing for these awards. Each district scholarship application package requires the following:

1. A completed [district scholarship application](#) form
2. A cover letter introducing yourself and explaining why you are a strong candidate for the scholarship.
3. A resume or curriculum vitae that includes:
 - a. Social insurance number
 - b. Community service
 - c. School service
 - d. Work experience
 - e. School achievements
 - f. Extra curricular activities
4. At least one letter of reference from a specialty area* (teacher, coach, or supervisor)
5. Transcript of grades

* A specialty refers to the focus of the scholarship. For example, students applying for music scholarships should provide a letter of reference from a music teacher.

Claremont Scholarship Requirements

The scholarships listed in this section are exclusively for Claremont students. Each application package requires the following:

1. A resume or curriculum vitae that includes:
 - a. Social insurance number
 - b. Community service
 - c. School service
 - d. Work experience
 - e. School achievements
 - f. Extra curricular activities
2. A cover letter introducing yourself and explaining why you are a strong candidate for the scholarship.
3. At least one letter of reference from a specialty area* (teacher, coach, or supervisor)
4. Transcript of grades

* A specialty refers to the focus of the scholarship. For example, students applying for music scholarships should provide a letter of reference from a music teacher.

Aaron Macri Memorial Scholarship

Applications to be submitted online (See Application Portal in the Claremont website)

- Value \$500
- About Aaron Macri:
 - In 2000, Aaron Macri began his teaching career in the Saanich School District, first teaching at Stelly's and then at Claremont (where he spent most of his career as a social studies teacher). He was a passionate and dynamic teacher of social studies, Law 12, and History 12.
- Criteria: To be awarded to a grade 12 student who has excelled in grade 12 level social studies courses. Preference will be given to students who have taken both Law 12 and History 12, and who are pursuing further studies in Humanities.

Include the following in your application package:

- The requirements listed on page 5
- Proof of acceptance at a post secondary institution in the same year as graduation

BC Achievement Scholarship

No application required

- Value: \$1250 Voucher
- Donor: BC Ministry of Education
- Students have up to 5 years to redeem this scholarship
- Criteria: The BC Achievement scholarship recognizes the 8,000 graduates with the top academic achievement in the province.
 - Students will be informed in November following their graduation.
 - For the purpose of this scholarship, academic achievement is based on the subset of grades 10–12 courses that are used to meet graduation requirements (including electives).

Most students graduate with more credits than required; only the courses used to meet graduation requirements are considered.

Canadian Federation of University Women

Applications to be submitted online (See Application Portal in the Claremont website)

- Value: \$1500 x 2
- Donor: Canadian Federation of University Women
- Criteria: awarded to a female graduating student who demonstrates both academic merit and financial need.
 - Open to all women including those who identify as part of the women's community.
 - Applicants must begin studies the same year as she graduates.
 - Applicants must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident

- A completed [district scholarship application](#) form
- a letter of confirmation of acceptance to a post-secondary institution
- A cover letter explaining her ambitions for post secondary education and how this award will be of value to her.

- Tenure: This is a one-time award intended to encourage a graduating student to pursue further education at a recognized BC Post-Secondary Institution.
- Criteria: This award will be awarded to a graduating student from Claremont Secondary School who meets the following criteria:
 - Is a resident of Cordova Bay. See [Map](#)
 - Is able to demonstrate commitment to the community, and that they possess good leadership skills.

Cordova Bay ȚEL, ȚŁĆE / cǎłłć First Nations Scholarship Award

Applications to be submitted online (See Application Portal in the Claremont website)

- Value: \$500
- Donor: Cordova Bay Association for Community Affairs
- Tenure: This is a one-time award intended to encourage students from ȚSÁNEĆ and łəkʷəŋən Nations to pursue further education at a recognized BC Post-Secondary Institution. The award is named after the original village site in Cordova Bay ȚEL, ȚŁĆE (in SENĆOTEN) cǎłłć (in łəkʷəŋən), and the CBACA honours young peoples' connections to this place into the future.
- Criteria: This award will be awarded to a graduating student from Claremont Secondary School who meets the following criteria:
 - Is a member of the ȚSÁNEĆ or łəkʷəŋən First Nations community (ie: Tsawout, Tsartlip, Tseycum, Pauchaquin, Songhees, Esquimalt, or other closely related First Nation).
 - Is able to demonstrate commitment to their community, through work on their culture, language, leadership skills, or other teachings that connect to their community.
- During the calendar year of the receipt of this award, the successful candidate is requested to write a letter to the Cordova Bay Association for Community Affairs to share how this award helped in their post-secondary studies.

Dianne Cross Award for the Arts

Application packages to be submitted on paper (not electronically) to Ms. Tong

- Value \$750
- Donor: ArtSea Community Arts Council Society
- Criteria: To be awarded to a graduating student to further enhance study in the Arts in any or all of the following areas:
 - Painting
 - Sculpture
 - Fibre
 - Dance
 - Drama
 - Music
 - Voice
- Award can be used for artistic development such as tuition, lesson fees, instrument purchase or rental.

Include the following in your application package:

- The requirements listed on page 4
- A completed [district scholarship application](#) form
- A letter of recommendation from current or previous instructor (inside or outside of school) stating your area of interest and level of ability

District Authority Awards

Applications to be submitted online (See Application Portal in the Claremont website)

Claremont will be awarding approximately 40 District Authority Awards across 7 different categories. The award is a voucher for \$1250 that can be redeemed once students have paid their tuition at a designated post-secondary institution. Not sure if your institution is included? Check [HERE](#)

- Value: \$1250 voucher for post-secondary tuition
- Donor: BC Ministry of Education
- Students have up to 5 years to redeem this scholarship
- Applicants must be a
 - Canadian citizen or Permanent Resident
 - BC resident
- Criteria: Recognizes graduating BC students for excellence in their chosen area of interest or strength.
 - Students may apply for more than one category but can only receive one.

- Criteria: Graduating full time student who demonstrates the following:
 - Excellence in academics and involvement in extra-curricular
 - Participation in work experience and/or volunteerism in a “teaching” situation, i.e. Teacher assistant, peer tutor/helper, elementary school volunteer, lab/shop assistant, etc.
 - Note:** If you do not have any work experience in a teaching situation, but believe you are a worthy candidate for the award, please apply.

Ed Kubek Memorial Scholarship

- Value: \$1000
- About Ed Kubek:
 - Ed Kubek was a Biology and PE teacher at Claremont who passed away from cancer in 2008. He was especially passionate about rugby and coached at Claremont throughout his career.
- Criteria: Applicants must
 - Exhibit athletic participation in school sports

- Please note: all school athletes are eligible for this award; however consideration will be given to students who played on the school rugby team
- Consideration will also be given to students who also demonstrate interest & high achievement in senior level biology

- At least one reference letter from a coach who can speak to your participation in a school sport.
- A cover letter that outlines applicant's leadership, dedication & commitment in athletic participation

Forrest Owens Memorial Scholarship

Application packages to be submitted on paper (not electronically) to Ms. Tong

- Value: \$1400
- About Forrest Owens:
 - Forrest Owens was a well-respected leader in the peninsula community. He played a key role in training Central Saanich Fire Department members and led fire prevention and inspection programs for many years. Forrest was an Assistant Chief for the Central Saanich Fire Department and served the community as a firefighter for more than 35 years. He was dedicated to community service and was involved in many areas of the community. Before becoming a firefighter, Forrest was a Red Seal carpenter. He felt that this knowledge and experience helped him when he joined the fire department as he understood residential and commercial construction and the BC Building code requirements. Forrest was also a strong advocate for mental health awareness for first responders.
- Eligibility:
 - Those who reside in the Municipality of Central Saanich, Tsartlip First Nation, or Tsawout First Nation are eligible.
- Criteria:
 - To support outstanding School District 63 (Saanich) students who are pursuing further education or training in the field of firefighting, fire safety, medical/first responder, emergency management or public

service. Consideration may be given for pursuit of a career in the field of construction.

- Students should demonstrate the following:
 - Good academic record, attendance and citizenship
 - Involvement in community activities, volunteer or service oriented work, sports achievement, etc.
 - Keen interest or specific skill in the area of endeavor.

- Proof of acceptance or registration in a post secondary program in one of the specialty areas listed above

Helen White Award

Applications to be submitted online (See Application Portal in the Claremont website)

- Value: between \$500 - \$1000 (varies by year)
- Criteria: graduating Grade 12 student in School District 63 who has excelled in at least one course at the grade 12 level in Home Economics (Foods Studies, Textiles, or Catering)
- Applicants must have demonstrated:
 - good school citizenship
 - a hard working and responsible ethic
 - leadership by action and or example

Include the following in your application package:

- The requirements listed on page 5
- A reference letter from a Home Economics teacher

High Street Ventures Foundation Scholarship

Application packages to be submitted on paper (not electronically) to Ms. Tong

- Value: \$800
- To support a graduating studying in Saanich School District pursuing education in the field of Construction Trades (carpentry, electrical, or plumbing)
- Criteria: students must have been accepted into a Foundation or Level 1 Program in their chosen field.

Jan Heinrichs Memorial Scholarship

Application packages to be submitted on paper (not electronically) to Ms. Tong

- Value: \$500+ (amount will vary)
- About Jan Heinrichs:
 - In 1992, Jan Heinrichs began building the distinct and powerful music program at Stelly's Secondary. During her 30 years at Stelly's, Ms Heinrichs instilled infectious excitement in her students for vocal, instrumental and theatrical music. The passion for performance she brought to students, the schools, and the community reflected the life-changing impact that the ARTS can have. She cared about, believed in and gave opportunity to thousands of students, going above and beyond with her compassion and caring for each individual.
- Criteria: to be awarded to a graduating Saanich student who has participated in a school-based music or drama program, and who intends to pursue post secondary education. The student will have demonstrated passion, integrity, and leadership through the encouragement of others.

- Cover Letter including details of interests and achievements in the Arts; how their personal journey has been influenced by participating in a school-based music or drama program; and a statement of goals and plans to include the Arts in their future

Joy Paquin Memorial Scholarship

Application packages to be submitted on paper (not electronically) to Ms. Tong

- Value: \$1000 each
- About Joy Paquin
 - Joy Paquin is remembered for being a dynamic, dedicated, and caring elementary school teacher in the Saanich School district.
- Criteria: For a student entering full time post-secondary education whose education goal is to become a K-12 teacher.

Include the following in your application package:

- The requirements listed on page 4
- Applicant must demonstrate the following:
 - Excellence in academics
 - Pursuing a career as a teacher (K-12)
 - Involvement in extra-curricular and/or community activities
- Proof of acceptance at a post secondary institution in the same year as graduation
- A separate statement, in paragraphs, of future plans and goals.

Lobstick Foundation Trades Bursary

Application packages to be submitted on paper (not electronically) to Ms. Tong

- Value: \$1000 x 2
 - 1 in the field of Health Care/ Nursing
 - 1 in the Trades
- Criteria: To support a graduating female student pursuing post-secondary education in **Health Care / Nursing** or in the **Trades**.
 - Additional consideration will be given to students who have faced financial hardship.

Include the following in your application package:

- The requirements listed on page 4

Lockwood Family Foundation Scholarship

Application packages to be submitted on paper (not electronically) to Ms. Tong

- Value: \$2000
- Criteria: To support a graduating student in Saanich School District pursuing further education or training in the field of Trades / Construction.
Acknowledges a student who has faced financial hardship and demonstrated a commitment to continue their education.

Include the following in your application package:

- The requirements listed on page 4
- Students should demonstrate the following:
 - Perseverance in achieving their academic goals; and
 - Proof of acceptance to a post-secondary institution / training program.

Marilyn Pinder Legacy Scholarship

Application packages to be submitted on paper (not electronically) to Ms. Tong

- Value: \$500 x 2
- About Marilyn Pinder:
 - Mme Pinder began her teaching career in 1981, dedicating all but one year to the Saanich School District. She had a strong reputation for her sense of humour, her frankness and her love of all students, but especially those students who persevered and were able to overcome hardships of any kind. She also committed countless hours to promoting second language acquisition and shared her love of the French language with students, staff and parents throughout the district. This scholarship was created to honour Mme Pinder and her many achievements in life.
- Criteria: An outstanding student entering full-time post secondary education who has overcome challenges and intends to continue learning a second language.

Include the following in your application package:

- The requirements listed on page 4
- A cover letter that describes how applicant has overcome challenges and intends to continue learning a second language.

Monk's Office Award

Applications to be submitted online (See Application Portal in the Claremont website)

This is a rotating Scholarship: Available to Claremont Grad Class 2026

- Value: varies
- Criteria: To support an outstanding student entering full-time post secondary education. Awarded to a Saanich graduating student who:
 - Is registered in a BC public/independent or Distance Ed school
 - Has a C+ grade average or better, overall
 - Received 80% in 3 recognized courses in related areas of specialty in grade 11 and 12
 - Specialty area examples include: science, humanities, IGS, mathematics, computer science, business, Fine Arts, etc...
 - Is pursuing environmental studies as an area of study.
