Attendance:

Students who are registered for AP Exams will be excused from their class periods to take their exams during those respective times and are expected to attend class periods that day other than those. For example, students who are registered for an AP Exam that has an 8am start time will be excused from their morning classes however will not be excused from their afternoon classes and are expected to attend their afternoon classes after their morning AP Exam concludes. Students who are taking afternoon exams will be expected to attend periods 1-4, and will be excused from their 4th period class at 11:45am to arrive at check in and attend their PM exam.

Cellphones

ALL cell phones will be collected by the proctor during student check in and will be stored in a secure location outside of the exam room. **Students will NOT be allowed to have access to their cell phones at any time during the exam (this includes breaks).**

All students must bring a valid form of ID for check in (MCHS School ID, Driver's License or Aeries Login on phone). You will not be allowed to enter and or take your exam without a valid form of ID.

Students must bring 2 clear Ziplock baggies.

• One clear ziplock baggie with their name on it to place their phone in. Please clearly write your name on the bag with a Sharpie. Proctors will collect this during check in and hold it in a secure location outside of the exam room.

 One clear ziplock baggie to store a snack (to be eaten only during the designated break outside of the exam room in the designated break area - students cannot have access to food/drink during the exam unless otherwise approved through College Board accommodations), extra pens/pencils, and a clear plastic water bottle and extra clothing such as a sweatshirt. This bag will be stored inside the exam room. Please clearly write your name on the bag with a Sharpie.

- 1. Students will show a valid form of ID (School ID, CA driver's license or Aeries login on their phone).
- 2. Students will turn their phone and smart watches off and place them in their clear Ziplock phone baggie, they will turn their clear ziplock phone baggie into the proctor where it will be placed in the designated area (OUTSIDE of the exam room). Students cannot access their phones until the completion of the exam and they are dismissed and sent home. Warn students that if they do not give you their phone as they walk in and they are found to have one during the exam, that an Incident Report will have to be written, their phone sent to the college board and their scores will not count.
- 3. If students have backpacks, they will be directed to place them outside of the exam room in the check in area. Students cannot have access to their backpacks during the exam.
- 4. Students will receive a seat number card and will enter the exam room and be directed to find their seat.
- 5. Students will place their clear ziplock baggie with extra supplies, food and drink in the exam room against the wall.
- 6. Seats will be numbered in rows Proctor will direct students to their seat number.

Prohibited Materials and Devices

Prohibited devices and reference materials shouldn't be accessible by students during exams. A student observed with a prohibited device/material during testing or breaks may be dismissed from the exam, the device may be confiscated, the student's score may be canceled, and no retest may be permitted.

Students are prohibited from bringing electronic equipment (phones, smartwatches, or wearable technology of any kind, laptops, tablet computers, Bluetooth devices, portable

listening or recording devices— MP3 player, iPod, etc.—cameras or other photographic equipment, devices that can access the internet, separate timers of any type, and any other electronic or communication devices) with them to the testing room.

Calculators may be used only for exam subjects that require or allow calculator use, following the calculator policy.

Cellphones

** Students are NOT allowed to bring any other electronic devices/equipment into the exam room. This includes air pods, apple / smart watches, fitbits. Bringing any electronic equipment into the exam room will result in an irregularity report, possible exam/score cancellation and other disciplinary actions imposed by the College Board and the MCHS Administration.

Social Media

Students cannot share AP Exam content or pictures before (this includes the check in line) during or after the AP Exam through any means including, but not limited to, email, text messages, phone calls, photographs, social media, or the internet. This will result in an irregularity report, possible exam/score cancellation and other disciplinary actions imposed by the College Board and the MCHS Administration. If a student posts to any form of social media during the exam, or refers to unreleased exam content at any time after the exam, the student's score will be canceled, no retest will be permitted, and the student may be permanently banned from future testing.

AP coordinators aren't able to update student information. Accommodations:

***Students with College Board Accommodations will be sent individual emails regarding their exam locations and where to report to. Dates and Reporting times are the same (7:30am for AM Exams / 12:15pm for PM Exams).

To take an AP Exam with accommodations, a student must be approved for accommodations by the College Board SSD office. Providing accommodations to students without College Board approval will result in cancellation of these students' scores. If you have completed the application process with the College Board to receive approved accommodations on your AP Exams your name will be listed in our AP Registration and Ordering system and you will receive an individual email regarding your exam day locations and reporting times.

***Students should bring their College Board SSD Eligibility Letter if they are taking an exam with approved testing accommodations.

Calculators:

Calculators are allowed only for some or all parts of AP Exams in these subjects: *Biology, Calculus (AB/BC), Chemistry, Environmental Science, Physics 1, Physics 2, Physics C: Mechanics, and Statistics.* Students may bring up to two permitted calculators to the exam. Graphing calculators must be on the approved calculator list. *Note: Calculators ARE NOT ALLOWED for any other AP Exams, including Computer Science A*, Computer Science Principles*, Macroeconomics*, and Microeconomics**

***Students need to visit <u>AP Exams Calculator Policy</u> or <u>apstudents.org/courses</u> and go to the calculator policy section within their course page for the specific calculator policy.

Extra Materials:

Students may bring a clear ziplock baggie to store a snack (to be eaten only during the designated break outside of the exam room in the designated break area - students cannot have access to food/drink during the exam unless otherwise approved through College Board accommodations), extra pens/pencils, and a clear plastic water bottle and extra clothing such as a sweatshirt. This bag will be stored outside of the exam room. Please clearly write your name on the bag with a Sharpie.

Bathroom:

Students must be accompanied by a proctor to the bathroom and may only enter the rest room one person at a time.

Breaks:

Each exam has a designated break embedded between parts I and II. During the break students cannot discuss the exam at all. This will result in an irregularity report and possible exam cancellation and other disciplinary actions imposed by the College Board and the MCHS Administration. Students will NOT be allowed to have access to their cell phones at any time during the breaks. Students leaving the designated break area or building without permission will not be allowed to return to the exam. They will be dismissed and not be readmitted to the exam room.

Mandatory Start Times:

All schools must begin the morning exam administration between 8am and 9 am local time, and the afternoon exam administration between 12pm and 1pm local time. AP Exams are timed tests. However, additional time is necessary and should be anticipated for tasks such as distributing materials, completing identification information on answer sheets, reading instructions aloud, collecting materials, etc. The total time of an AP Exam administration can vary considerably, depending on the number of students involved. *Students should plan to spend at least 3 hours taking their exam.*

Students who have 2 exams (AM and PM) scheduled for the same day will be directed to go straight to their afternoon exam after the AM Exam concludes. Students will have time to eat lunch briefly in between each exam.

ALL Students must stay for the entire duration of the exam and cannot be dismissed early. **Students should plan to spend at least 3 hours taking their exam.**

Late Testing Exam Administration Dates: 5/17/22-5/20/22

Occasionally, circumstances make it necessary for students to test late. To preserve the security of AP Exams, alternate forms are used for late testing. All students who participate in late testing at a given school must take these alternate exams on **the scheduled late-testing dates at the scheduled times**: 2022 AP Exam Late-Testing Dates.

Students with two exams scheduled for the same date and time will need to take one of their exams in the late administration window. Individual emails (email associated with your College Board account) will be sent to these students to make arrangements.

Students who are registered for both the **AP Spanish and AP Biology** exams will need to move their AP Biology exam to the late testing window as the Language Lab component of the AP Spanish exam will carry over into the official start time of the AP Biology exam. Individual emails (email associated with your College Board account) will be sent to these students to make arrangements.

Students who have two exams scheduled for the same day (AM and PM) and receive accommodations for extra time will need to move one of their exams to the late administration window as the accommodation for extra time will carry over into the official start time of their afternoon exams. Individual emails will be sent to these students (email associated with your College Board account) to make arrangements.

If you do not enter the join code an exam will not be ordered for you. Online purchasing in the MCHS ASB Web Store will not be available for students who have not entered their class join code by September 10th.
