

Ola Middle School Rising 6th Grade FAQs

Attendance

Please email your student's Teachers when they'll be absent. Also, send a handwritten note and/or excuse to Mrs. Crystal Mings, Attendance Secretary, in the front office upon their return to school.

Backpacks

Backpacks only need to contain essential items needed for daily use at school. Textbooks remain at home once distributed. Also, please remind your student to check their backpack each evening for necessary supplies for the next school day.

Chromebook

Chromebooks should be charged at home each night. Teachers may not have spare chargers.

Conflict/Disagreements

Having discussions with your student in advance about the best ways to handle peer conflicts can be helpful. Use role-playing to practice choosing the best response in different situations so that your student has a guide for what to do in similar situations.

Connections Schedule Changes

Fine Arts classes (Band, Chorus, Orchestra, and Theatre) are the only connections classes students can request to join. All non-Fine Arts connections classes are set unless a student has a severe or medical condition that requires a schedule change. If this is the case, the parent/guardian should conference with the Teacher first and then the Grade Level Administrator (if needed). After this time, the Counselor will receive guidance from the Administrator regarding the potential schedule change.

Getting Lost

It is difficult for students to 'get lost' when going from class to class. Most of the classes for sixth graders will take place on the sixth grade hallway. Each Teacher has their name and room number on the outside of their classroom door. Students should practice looking at their schedule to see their Teachers' names and room numbers for each class period listed. Some students may have classes that take place in the trailers, which are located outside along the bus lane (which is directly outside of the doors of the sixth grade hallway/cafeteria). Currently, our trailers each have a number on the outside (from 1-10). Students will know if one of their classes will take place in a trailer if the room number on their schedule is listed with a 'T' (e.g.

T2 or T3). When it is time for the students to go to their connections classes (currently the last two class periods of the day), the sixth grade Teacher will walk with their entire class and take them to the connections hallway.

Google Classroom

Google Classroom is utilized by all classes and they should be checked daily.
