PE Days

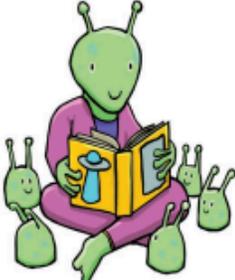
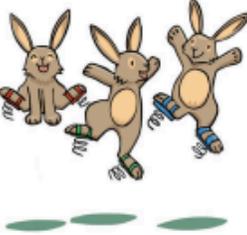
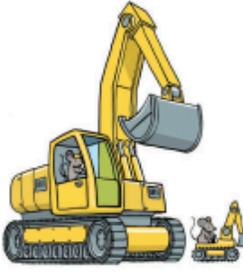
