Articles of Confederation

The A.O.C. were the first rules of the United States. Because the Americans hated the strength of the English Monarch, they created a loose set of rules (constitution) to govern themselves.

P. 120 Trouble with Britain	Dates: 1783 <u>Difficult to enforce treaties like the Treaty of</u> <u>Paris. British would not get out of the great lakes</u> <u>forts.</u>
P. 121 Trade with Britain	Dates:1783 Problems with England were trading, <u>Britain</u> <u>closed many of its ports, England forced</u> <u>Americans to pay high tariffs (taxes)</u>

P. 121 Trouble with Spain	Dates:1784 Problems with trading with Spain that Spain closed the lower Mississippi
p. 122 Impact of Closed Markets	Dates: 1785 Closed Markets affected the United States economy by Farmers could no longer export their goods to the West Indies. They had to hire British ships which was very expensive. British Goods flowed freely into the US. This hurt American business.
P. 122 Economic Problems	The Economic problems that developed were War debts, weak economy, states began to tax each other, inflation (states began to issue large amounts of paper money).
