Action Item(s)

Short term (2022)

- Jaime and Gretchen
 - Introduce Colton to Jason (city grant writer) for support.
 - o Introduce Colton to folks leading the Race St. project.
 - Coordinate group field trip to Race St.(?)
 - Evaluate Race St.
 - If we are serious about a skate park at Race St., maybe that's where we focus our efforts and funding. We don't want to confuse the community with partial funding to the existing park.
 - Determine if we could use the Community Block Development Grant (CBDG) for the skatepark
- Colton
 - Start conversations with Skatepark Project Foundation to identify direction (i.e., renovating existing park with new concrete structures or new park at Race St.?).
 - "If your organization seeks funds for anything other than the construction of a NEW skatepark in the United States (including projects such as expansion of an existing skatepark or amenities like bleachers or water fountains), it is not eligible to apply for a grant from The Skatepark Project."

Goal(s)

By the end of 2022:

Decide on Race St. or the existing MARC park.

- MARC would have to be entirely rebuilt and be done in concrete to abide by The Skatepark Project application criteria.
- Have a rough execution plan and proposed design
- Form a group of allies to meet monthly(?)

Meeting Notes

- The Skatepark Project Grants
 - "The Skatepark Project offers grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$300,000. The average grant amount for a National Program applicant is \$10,000. Built To Play Grants range from \$50,000 to \$300,000."
 - If your organization seeks funds for anything other than the construction of a
 NEW skatepark in the United States (including projects such as expansion of an
 existing skatepark or amenities like bleachers or water fountains), it is not
 eligible to apply for a grant from The Skatepark Project.
 - Has to be concrete construction.
 - Can't be privately owned.
 - Need to start with "grassroots" campaign and display community and city support for better chance.
 - TYPES OF PROJECTS: Many types of public concrete skatepark projects can be eligible for a skatepark construction grant from The Skatepark Project.
 - New Skatepark Construction
 - Skateable Art Sculptures
 - Active City Space Conversion (legalizing skateboarding in shared spaces)
- Casey Miller
 - Firehouse. Miller brother's staffing. New construction company. Very willing to help with projects for the kids
- Jason (City grant writer.)
 - o To help with grants for the skate park since it's owned by the city.
 - Maybe Gretchen or Jaime could introduce me and I could seek their advice while talking to the Skatepark Project Foundation and finding other available grants.

 - Connecting dots and knows people
- Plea on Meadville city facebook page "support the park".
