BACKGROUND INFORMATION FOR LEARNERS

In the 20th century, there were Filipino scholars who took indigenous movement and argued for a shift in perspective to be used in understanding Filipino personality, situation, and environment and in writing our history as well.

According to Pe-Pua et. al. (2000), *Sikolohiyang Pilipino* (Filipino psychology) refers to the psychology born out of the experience and orientation of the Filipinos, based on the full use of Filipino culture and language. The approach is one of indigenization from within, whereby the theoretical framework and methodology emerge from the experiences of the people from the indigenous culture. It was formalized in 1975 by the *Pambansang Samahan sa Sikolohiyang Pilipino* (National Association for Filipino Psychology) under the leadership of Virgilio Enriquez, who is regarded by many as the father of Filipino Psychology.

The *pantayong pananaw* (from-us-for-us perspective) is the brainchild of Prof. Zeus Salazar. *Pantayong Pananaw* insisted that the Philippine History should be written and consumed primarily by Filipinos. In this regard, language plays a central role; hence, historians identified with pantayong pananaw speak and write in Philippine languages so that the talastasan (discourse) is always oriented toward local cultures and not to 'outsiders' and their interests (Guillermo, 2009).

Basic Tenets of Sikolohiyang Pilipino

1. Core value or Kapwa (shared inner self)

Kapwa is the core construct of Filipino Psychology. Kapwa has two categories, Ibang Tao and Hindi Ibang Tao.

• *Ibang Tao* ("outsider")

There are five interaction levels under this category:

o *Pakikitungo*: civility – This is the right behavior or right demeanor towards authorities (Parents, Elders, etc.).

- o *Pakikisalamuha*: act of mixing This is a social value that is primarily communitarian. It espouses the ability to adapt.
- o *Pakikilahok*: act of joining This translates to participation of the entire community to help a person.
- o *Pakikibagay*: conformity This runs into conflict with individuality which many Filipinos in fact willingly throw away in favor of conformity with demands of those who are in charge.
- o *Pakikisama*: being united with the group-This is the folk concept of good human relations and implies giving in or yielding to the wish of the majority even if it contradicts one's own ideas.
- Hindi Ibang Tao ("one-of-us")

There are three interaction levels under this category:

- o *Pkikipagpalagayang-loob*: act of mutual trust-This is an assured reliance on the characters, ability, strength, or truth of someone or something.
- o *Pakikisangkot*: act of joining others- This is to participate with (someone) in some act or activity.
- o *Pakikipagkaisa*: being one with others- This is to unite or put into association of two or more different people, groups, organizations, etc.

2. Pivotal interpersonal value

Pakiramdam: Shared inner perceptions.
 Filipinos use damdam, or the inner perception of others' emotions, as a basic tool to guide their dealings with other people.

3. Linking socio-personal value

• Kagandahang-Loob: Shared humanity. It refers to being able to help other people in dire need due to a perception of being together as a part of one Filipino humanity.

4. Accommodative surface values

- Hiya: Loosely translated as 'shyness' by most Western psychologists.
 It is referred to as 'sense of propriety'.
- Utang na loob: Norm of reciprocity.
 Filipinos are expected by their neighbors to return favors-whether these were asked for or not—when it is needed or wanted.
- Pakikisama and Pakikipagkapwa: Smooth Interpersonal Relationship, or SIR, as coined by Lynch (1961 and 1973).
 This attitude is primarily guided by conformity with the majority.

5. Confrontative surface values

Bahala na: It is translated as "determination in the face of uncertainty" and
is used as an expression, almost universally, in Filipino culture.
It is also about an indication of an acceptance of the nature of things,
including the inherent limitations of oneself.

- Lakas ng loob: This attitude is characterized by being courageous in the midst of problems and uncertainties.
- Pakikibaka: It refers to the ability of the Filipino to undertake revolutions and uprisings against a common enemy.

6. Societal values

- *Karangalan*: It refers to what other people see in a person and how they use that information to make a stand or judge about his/her worth.
 - o *Puri*: The external aspect of dignity. May refer to how other people judge a person of his/her worth. This compels a common Filipino to conform to social norms, regardless how obsolete they are.
 - o *Dangal*: The internal aspect of dignity. May refer to how a person judges his own worth.
- *Katarungan*: Loosely translated to justice, this refers to equity in giving rewards to a person.
- *Kalayaan*: Freedom and mobility. Ironically, this may clash with the less important value of *pakikisama* or *pakikibagay* (conformity).




