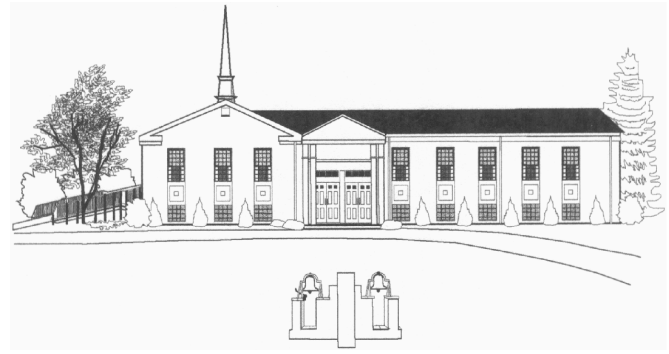

### Building Endurance

*To keep me from being too elated, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to torment me, to keep me from being too elated. Three times I appealed to the Lord about this, that it would leave me, but he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." – 2 Corinthians 12:7-9*

In Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians, he spills a lot of ink defending his credentials as an Apostle and Overseer of their church. In a recent session of the Hopeful Sunday School Class, we noticed how his defense of his Apostleship ultimately rests in the suffering he endured for the sake of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. He refers to it sometimes as sharing in Christ's own suffering.

Here, in the passage quoted above, Paul gets to the reason why his suffering is such an important proof of his credentials and credibility as an Apostle and Overseer: It has built his Christian character.

In these verses, we see how suffering a "thorn in the flesh" lead to humility. Paul received visions, was taken to heaven "in the spirit", and heard the voice of the spirit reveal truths to him. He was a learned man of sound breeding. He had been a Pharisee and leader among the Jewish religious establishment before his conversion.

Here is a man who had reason to boast!

This thorn in the flesh, whatever it was, knocked him down several pegs. It must have been a disability which made him dependent on others for certain things. This malady most assuredly made him aware of his dependence on God and God's power to help him overcome.

***"Power is made perfect in weakness."***

Suffering through this weakness lead to spiritual growth for him.

Paul writes in Romans 5:3-5, ***"We also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us."***

Suffering builds us up! This is the great truth Paul taught to the Corinthians, using himself as the prime example!

Suffering this "thorn in the flesh" changed him. Once he was an arrogant, vindictive man. He persecuted the Church of Christ. He looked down on others. He believed that he was better than anyone else. He met Christ and everything changed. He became a believer, an evangelist, and a defender of the faith he tried to destroy.

The thorn in the flesh brought him down low. The lessons he learned as he coped with that malady built his character. He had to lean on God and learn that grace is sufficient. He had to lean on others and learned how to live within a caring Christian Community.

Remember, when Paul saw Christ on the Road to Damascus and was converted, he was blinded and led by the hand, probably by his servants, to the house of Ananias to receive his sight? There in the house of Ananias, he was forgiven and welcomed into the body of believers. Later, believers patiently taught him the Word of Christ, preparing him for the ministry that was ahead.

Suffering brought him down. Going through the suffering, Paul rose, a believer, a leader, and an Apostle of Christ Jesus.

Suffering builds us up.

Every person who has ever trained to play a sport knows this. Every person who has successfully completed a course of physical therapy has experienced it. Our bodies become stronger through exercise: Running, cycling, weights, bands, whatever. Our bodies are strengthened through suffering!

The same is true about our spiritual lives: We are made perfect through our suffering. It is through suffering that we learn that the grace of God is sufficient for our need. It is through suffering that we learn how to rest in the care of our Christian sisters and brothers.

Spiritual growth comes most often to those who have walked through the dark valley of suffering. Over the years, I have come to know many people who seem to have a deep spiritual center. Almost every time I learn their personal stories, I hear stories about a mental or physical malady they had to overcome, or a family tragedy they had to process, or a crisis they had to face. Almost always, times of great trial and suffering lead to the steadfast faith and spiritual centeredness that was evident in their lives.

***“Power is made perfect in weakness.”***

Character was built. Centeredness of Spirit was achieved. Deep connection with God and the people of God took place. And a deepening commitment to ministry in His name also took place. This is the fruit of suffering.

Through suffering we change and grow. God can use our suffering to form and reform us until at last we perfectly bear the image and likeness of Christ, to God’s eternal glory.

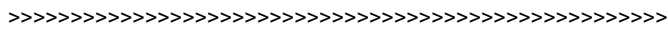

Parenting is hard. Parents have to choose their battles. This list is immensely helpful & challenging.

**The Reading Fight:** Make your kids read. Because reading is tied to everything from cognitive development to the ability to focus. Make your kids read now.

**The Outside Fight:** Make your kids go outside. The natural world teaches us things. Plus, outside there's sunshine, fresh air, and exercise waiting for them. Most importantly, nature is full of things in short supply in our world:

Discovery, wonder, peace, joy.

**The Work Fight:** Make your kids work. I'm saddened by how many parents don't require their kids to lift a finger at home. There are priceless life principles you can only learn with a mop in your hand. Let sweat be their teacher.

**The Meal Fight:** Make your kids eat as a family. Our lives are a blur of incessant activity. Meals together are a physical pause to recover a truth so easily sacrificed at the altar of busyness. Nothing's more important than family.

**The Boredom Fight:** Make your kids live with boredom. Don't show a DVD on each car ride. Kids need unscheduled time. And, odd as it sounds, boredom is a skill. It's hard as a parent to deal with the assault of boredom complaints. But if you give in and fill their time with external stimuli, you'll raise an activity addict. Make them learn how to



**The "Me First" Fight:** Make your kids go last. Not every time for everything. But enough to remember that the world doesn't revolve around them. Take the smallest piece. Give up the remote. Do someone else's chores. Get their least favorite choice. They won't like it, but they need it.

**The Awkward Conversation Fight:** Make your kids have uncomfortable conversations with you. Sex, dating, body image, values...Your kids will roll their eyes and resist. You will stumble and stutter. They need and want your perspective, lessons learned, and wisdom.

**The Limitation Fight:** Learning to live within limits is a valuable life skill. In fact, many adult problems arise from an inability to accept them. Screen time limits, dietary limits, activity limits, and schedule limits are all good.

**Jacksonville Lion’s Club** - Our local Lions Club collects eyeglasses & cases, hearing aids, used printer cartridges, medical equipment, assistive devices (wheelchairs, walkers, crutches, shower/tub seats, bedside potty chairs, etc.) If in doubt, ask. Smaller items can be placed in boxes in the church and TFC foyers. Call Dave at 717-422-8907 for more donation information or to borrow medical aids on a temporary basis.

**Mission Central** - This busy facility in Mechanicsburg is home to MANY missions within the warehouse and around the world. They accept old cell phones, electronics, large household items, and almost anything else that could possibly be used by others (except TVs). Give them a call at 717-766-1533 for specific inquiries.

**Changing Hands** – This equipment exchange & reuse program is run by the United Cerebral Palsy of Central PA. Call 1-800-996-4827 to donate hover lifts, scooters, communication devices, vision aids, and many other items.
