



Fraser Public Schools Phase 4 Reopening Procedures

1. Require the use of hand sanitizer before entering the bus. Hand sanitizer must be supplied on the bus. – **Installed on all Fraser Public School Buses**
2. The bus driver, staff, and all students in grades preK-12, if medically feasible, will wear facial coverings while on the bus. Note: there may be situations where it is not safe for the bus driver to wear a facial covering. Decisions about these situations should be made on a case-by-case basis with local public health officials. – **Fraser Public Schools Bus Drivers will carry masks on the bus for those students who forget them.**
3. Clean and disinfect transportation vehicles before and after every transit route. Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces in the vehicle (e.g., surfaces in the driver's cockpit, hard seats, arm rests, door handles, seat belt buckles, light and air controls, doors and windows, and grab handles) prior to morning routes and prior to afternoon routes. Children must not be present when a vehicle is being cleaned. – **Fraser Public Schools purchased handheld battery operated electrostatic spray machines that will be used to sanitize the buses after each route. In the event they don't arrive prior to school starting each bus will have a handheld spray bottle that will be used to sanitize the buses as required. Each bus will be equipped with a cleaning kit too.**

4. Clean, sanitize, and disinfect equipment including items such as car seats, wheelchairs, walkers, and adaptive equipment being transported to schools daily. - **Fraser Public Schools purchased handheld battery operated electrostatic spray machines that will be used to sanitize the buses after each route. In the event they don't arrive prior to school starting each bus will have a handheld spray bottle that will be used to sanitize the buses as required.**



5. Create a plan for getting students home safely if they are not allowed to board the vehicle.
If a student becomes sick during the day, they must not use group transportation to return home and must follow protocols outlined above. – School administration will keep the student in the designated isolation room until an approved individual can pick up the sick student.
6. If a driver becomes sick during the day, they must follow protocols for sick staff outlined above and must not return to drive students. – The transportation department will assign a substitute driver to replace the sick driver for that route.
7. Weather permitting, keep doors and windows open when cleaning the vehicle and between trips to let the vehicles thoroughly air out. – Fraser Schools will follow this recommendation weather permitting.
8. Weather permitting, consider keeping windows open while the vehicle is in motion to help reduce spread of the virus by increasing air circulation, if appropriate and safe. - Fraser Schools will encourage this recommendation weather permitting.
