I will remember that using technology at school is a privilege.

As a respectful, responsible, and caring student and a digital citizen, I pledge to:

Be Responsible:

Be responsible. I will ...

- remember that my device is a tool for learning
- do my best to complete my online learning, schoolwork, and assignments in school and at home if necessary.
- be careful with my device by:
 - carrying it with two hands.
 - putting it down on a clean, flat surface.
 - keeping food and drinks away from my device.
- tell my teacher and parent or caregiver if my device is broken, stolen, or lost.

Stay safe. I will ...

- keep my school account passwords private and only share them with my teacher and parent or caregiver.
- keep personal information to myself unless I have my family's permission. (This includes my full name, date of birth, address, phone number, and photos or videos of myself or others.)
- tell my teacher or an adult I trust if anything makes me uncomfortable online.

Be Respectful:

Think first. I will ...

- remember that my teachers can see whatever I do and say on the school's device or any device when I am logged in with my school email. This includes during video meetings, in emails and chats, and on documents.
- give credit to the sources of online information I use for schoolwork.
- know that not all information online is true.

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Be Caring:

Speak up. I will ...

- tell my teacher if I'm confused about anything or need help.
- be an Upstander and tell my teacher or an adult I trust if I see someone being treated poorly or unfairly.

Stay balanced. I will ...

- set specific times to use my device for online learning and schoolwork (if I use my device at home).
- follow my family's technology expectations.
- make sure there's time in my day for doing activities that don't involve electronic devices, like exercising and eating healthy food.
- "pause for people" and look up if someone wants to talk to me when I'm on my device.

In exchange, my parent(s) or caregiver(s) will ...

- support my digital learning by setting me up for success by creating family technology expectations (such as: time limits, accessing age appropriate apps/games/websites).
- help me use technology responsibly and safely and be a good digital citizen.
- talk to me about the consequences of my behavior.

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
