- b. Community Garden- Parents wanting to see the lawn. We have tried many things with the grass. The mud will come and go. Grass is overseeded every summer to try to cut down on the mud. Nothing seems to work. They've done extra irrigation, topsoil, etc. There are 350 children playing on the lawn. Facilities has exhausted all options for reducing mud. If there were an easy option, it would be done. Overseeding, extra soil, etc have all been done. It takes 14 days for a seed to sprout and root, so noone would be able to do this during the school year. They overseed it every summer when there is less traffic.
