**USDA Non-discrimination Statement:**

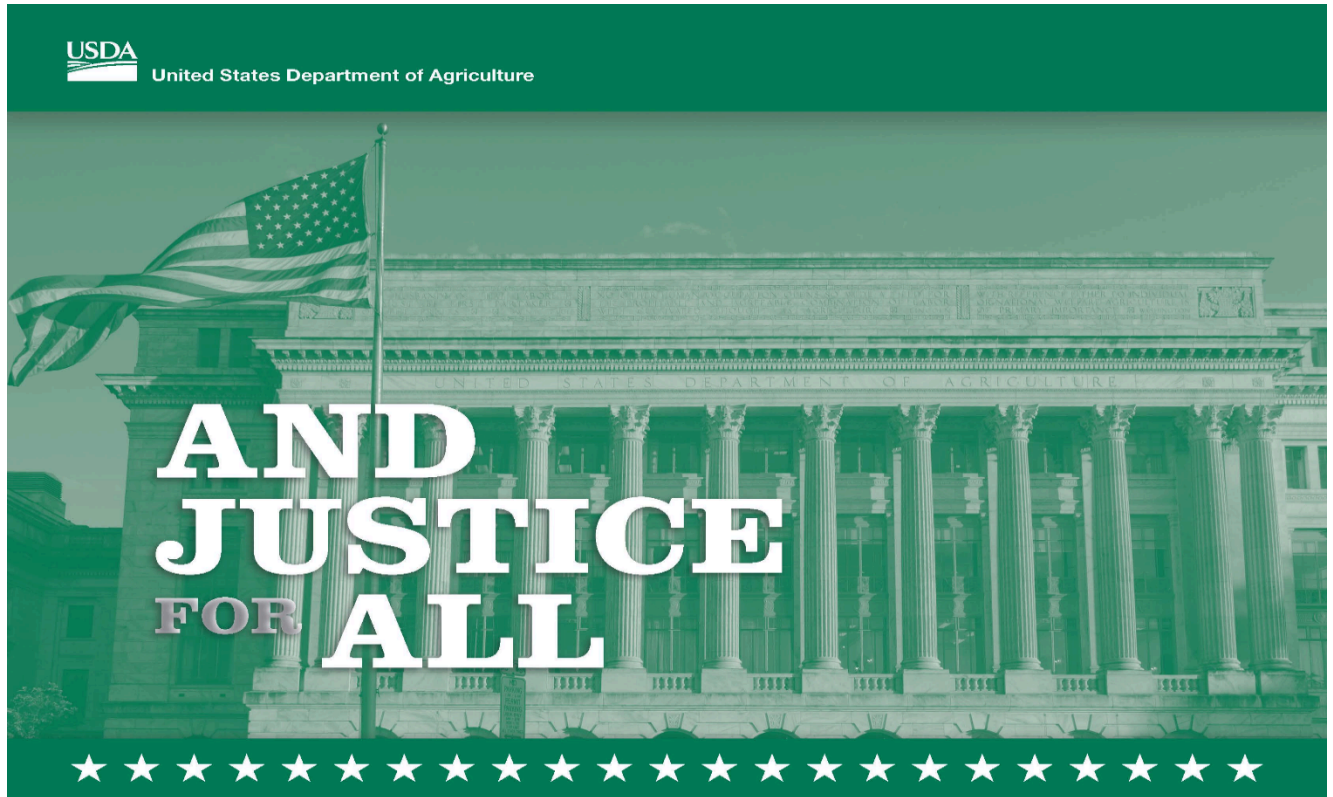
