


(What you have to know)	Baja California
History	Americas' oldest wine industry From the 1960s onwards: - Demand for base wine for distillation into brandy (Mexico is a huge producer) and cheap, often sweet, still and sparkling wine - Foreign investment (e.g. Domecq, Martell etc) - Protectionist duties on imports of wines and spirits
CLIMATE & WEATHER	- Mediterranean climate
	- Cold Alaska current causing morning fogs, and providing useful humidity for the vines
	- Rainfall very low at around 250 mm
GRAPE VARIETIES	<ul> <li>European black varieties: e.g. Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Malbec, Nebbiolo, Syrah and Carignan</li> <li>Varieties found in California: e.g. Zinfandel, Petite Sirah, and Ruby Cabernet</li> <li>Some American hybrids</li> <li>White varieties, e.g. Colombard, Trebbiano and Palomino (also used for brandy production) and Chenin Blanc</li> </ul>
VITICULTURE	- Strong Californian influence especially from UC Davis
	- Use of the AXR1 rootstock, which succumbed to phylloxera
	- Irrigation used whenever possible from underground aquifers
	- Salination problems
	- Espalier training widely used
	- Still some ungrafted vines
Wine Styles	- Best wines full-bodied reds, with Petite Sirah and Zinfandel particularly successful - Petite Sirah makes dark, well-balanced, tannic wines, not particularly distinctive in flavour but certainly agreeable and drinkable
PRODUCTION & BUSINESS	- 4th largest wine producer in Latin America (Brazil is 3rd), with some 50,000 ha of vineyards - Only 10% of vineyards produce grapes destined to be made into wine for drinking; the rest = grapes for distillation into brandy, or table grapes and grapes for drying - Around 1 million hl of wine produced in an average year
	Producers 3 major producers and a small number of boutique wineries, mainly producing Bordeaux- style blends
	Mexico has a tradition of blending imported wine. There is now a requirement that a wine bearing the mention Hecho en Mexico on the label must be made entirely from Mexican grown grapes.
