

Template for Community Wildfire Evacuation Drills

A community wildfire evacuation drill template should include sections for: **basic information, designated roles, communication plan, evacuation routes, designated meeting points, pre-drill preparation, drill scenarios, post-drill debriefing, and necessary contact details**; ensuring all residents understand their roles and responsibilities during a potential wildfire evacuation, while practicing key steps like gathering essential items, following designated routes, and reaching designated safe zones.

Template:

1. Basic Information:

Community Name, Date and Time of Drill, Drill Coordinator, and Contact Information.

2. Designated Roles:

- **Community Leaders:**
 - Neighborhood Captains
 - Vulnerable Population Checkers
 - Communication Relay
- **Emergency Responders:**
 - Fire Department Liaison
 - Law Enforcement Support
 - Medical Personnel

3. Communication Plan:

- **Alert System:** (e.g., sirens, community notification app, door-to-door announcements)
- **Communication Channels:**
 - Local Radio Stations
 - Social Media Pages

4. Evacuation Routes:

- **Regular Updates:** Review and update the evacuation plan based on changing conditions and community feedback.
- **Practice Drills:** Conduct drills regularly to maintain preparedness and familiarity with procedures.
