SBAN Equity Initiative

On Saturday, June 1, The Swarthmore Black Alumni Network hosted an interactive dialogue during their annual Alumni Weekend Town Hall to inspire meaningful, measurable, and collaborative action among SBAN members and the greater Swarthmore Community regarding equity leading to forming the SBAN Equity Initiative Task Force. SBAN (Swarthmore Black Alumni Network)

Swarthmore Black Alumni Network is defined as all alumni who identify as Black or Black Multi/racial, with nearly 1,600 living alumni. Historically, SBAN has been the college's most active affinity group, with an established Executive Committee and two Co-Chairs. They host campus events, regional events, and student events. They also collaborate on service projects with the college's centers, departments, and the larger community.

Goal:

The goal of this workshop is to inspire understanding, alignment and accountability that leads to collaborative, measurable action over a 12 month timeline addressing the issue of inequity in Chester.
