-Anyone may recycle their assessments.

-For each incorrect answer please complete the following steps:

1. Find the correct answer and either the Learning Target (standard) or objective, then write them down.
2. Tell me how you figured out this answer; cite the 2-3 sentences from the book or other resource where you found this information and give the page number or url.
3. Answer the following questions: Where did you make your mistake? What was your thought process and where did you go wrong? What was it about this concept or question that you did not understand? Be very specific.
4. What will you do next time to make sure that you don't get this wrong again? (Include specific strategies that we have talked about in class that you will use to help you, such as study strategies or test taking strategies)

You must turn in the following: your original test, completed initial reflection, proficiency tier, and all steps to recycle

How this effects your test grade!

- This is an **ALL** or nothing recycle. You either complete **ALL** of the questions and steps in the recycle (specifically and with care) or you will **NOT** earn any points.
- You will earn back half of the points for each question wrong, if you complete the recycle correctly. (For example, if you earn a 50/100 originally, and then you complete the recycle correctly. Your new grade will be a 75/100.)

Question #1

1. The correct response is C. a study of natural events and conditions. The objective is "Understand that science is the study of natural events and conditions."
2. I found the correct response by rereading page 6 where it states the definition of science as "the systematic study of natural events and conditions."
3. I got this question incorrect because I did not remember the definition of science. I was able to narrow the possible correct responses to C or D. I chose D because I did remember that science explains what happens around us, and D stated that science is "a complete explanation of everything that happens in the universe."
4. I will make sure to better prepare myself for an assessment next time by properly studying. I will create flash cards for all of the vocabulary terms, and then quiz myself by looking at the term and providing the definition, and then look at the definition and provide the term. I will not stop studying the flashcards until I get them all correct 3 consecutive times both ways (term to definition, definition to term).
