READ THOROUGHLY THE LAST PAGE IS REQUIRED FOR AUDITIONS. You will not be allowed to audition without the signed contract.

IMPORTANT DATES:

Auditions - September 3rd or 4th after school (choose the day best for you) Students are expected to come prepared for the audition with one monologue to read and one song to sing. The options for sides and songs are included in this packet. Students audition privately in front of the directors only. Students considered for leads will receive a phone call inviting them to "call backs" on September 5th. The cast will be posted on the Crestview Performance blog on September 6th after school.

EXPECTATIONS:

<u>Attendance</u>: If you are unable to attend a rehearsal, you are required to email Steph Strasser to excuse the absence. After two unexcused absences, students will not be permitted to participate. Please look ahead now for any appointments or conflicts and make adjustments to avoid problems.

Punctuality: Every cast member must be at rehearsal at the specified time. This time is 3:25 on regular days and 1:20 on short days. Recurring lateness will result in being asked to leave the show.

No one will be excused from dress rehearsals or performances.

<u>Behavior</u>: To be a member of the cast is a privilege and, therefore, should be treated as one. <u>Disruptive or disrespectful behavior will not be tolerated</u>. Any such behavior will result in expulsion from the play.

Students must come to rehearsals **prepared** to do silent, independent work in the designated area when not on stage.

<u>Parent Involvement</u>: Parents are responsible for arranging transportation after rehearsal. Rehearsals finish at 5:00pm on regular school days, 3:20 on short days (unless otherwise noted).

Parents also are required to **volunteer** at least **three** hours in order to make this show successful. If you are not able to volunteer, you will need to **pay \$30** to cover the time.
