Mystery Student Unveiled: You Won't Want to Miss it By: Jameson Lavallee

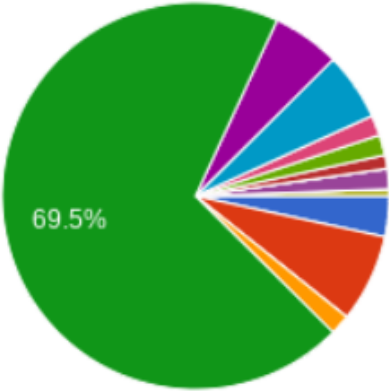

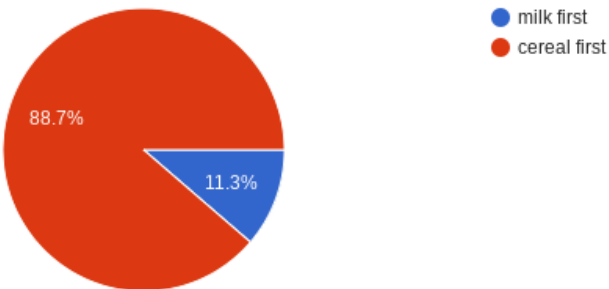
Have you passed by somebody while in a hot debate with your friend and wondered, "what do they think?" Well now you get a little insight into what students think.
