Group A Scored -15, Group B Scored -20, Group C Scored -10

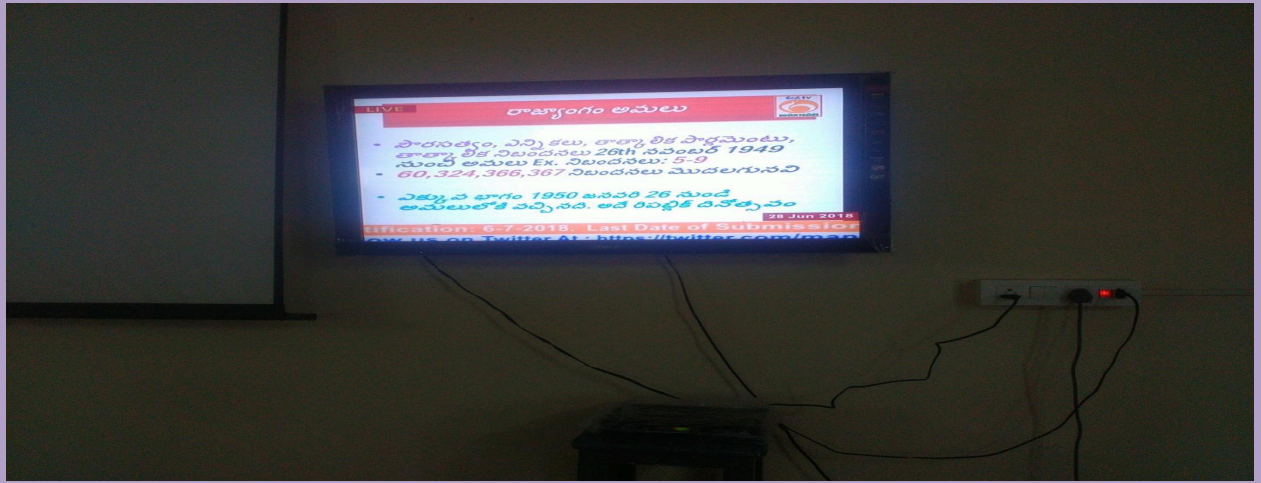
*Quiz Master -5 Total -50 Group B got Highest Score and Stood

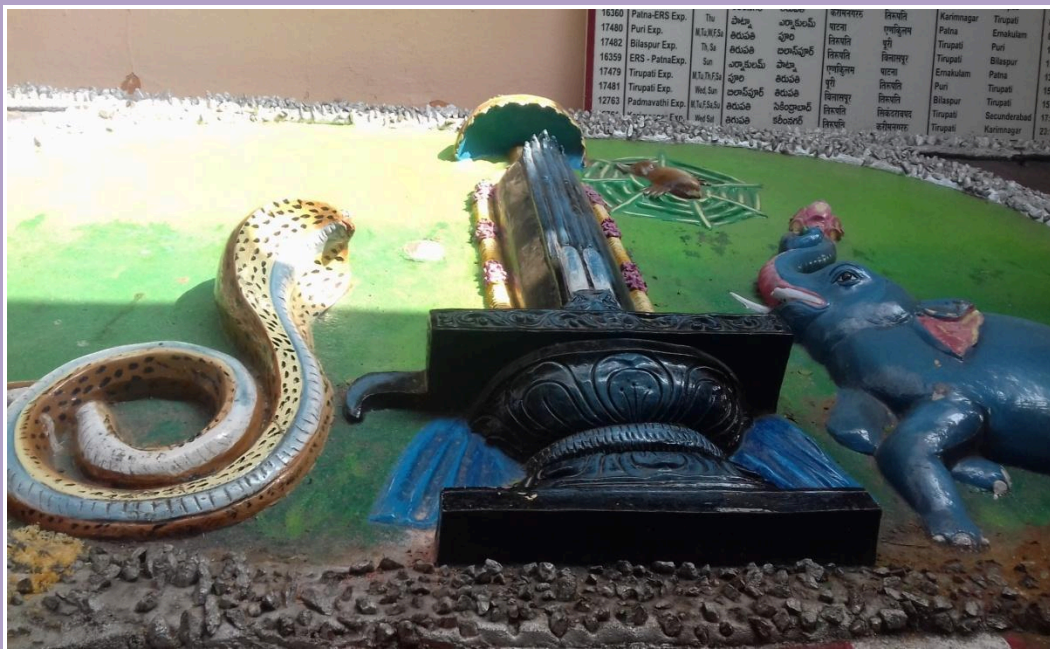

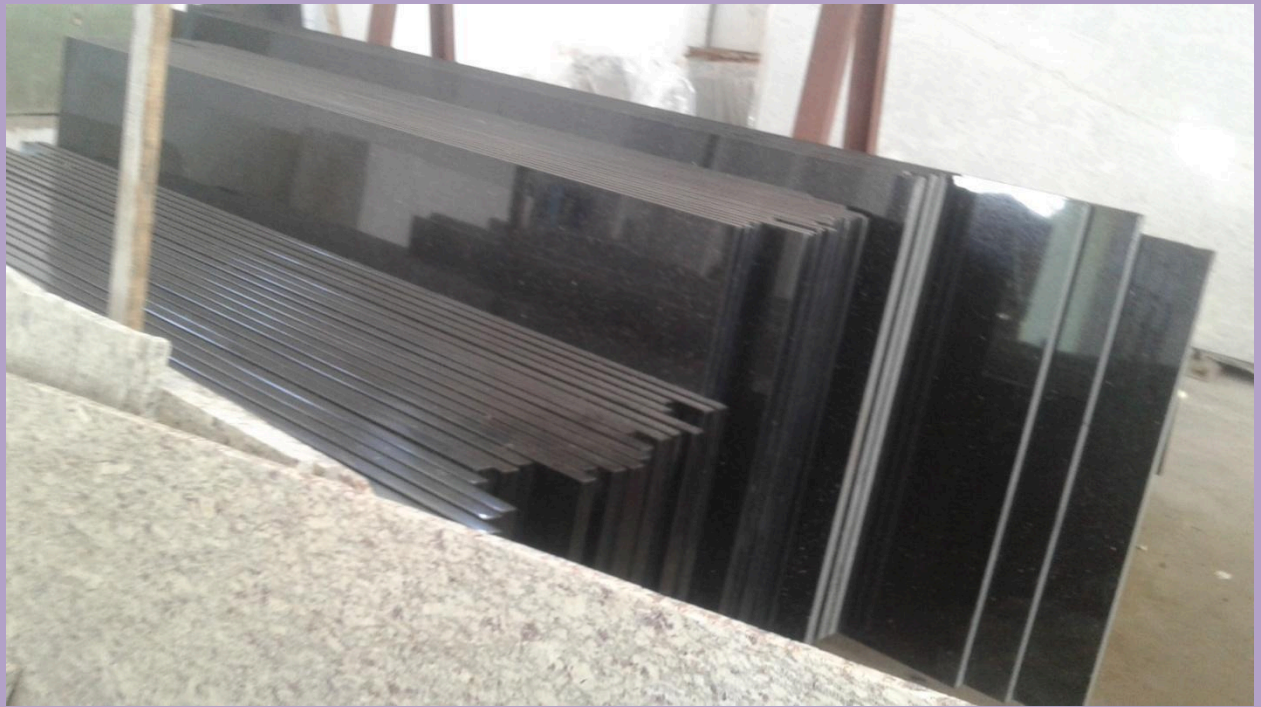
