What were the roles and responsibilities of Children in the Iroquois Confederacy?

- Children were often around and listening when adults held discussions
- Discussions were part of daily life in longhouses
- Children grew up hearing about issues and learning how decisions were made
- Boys and girls both knew that they would have important roles in the Iroquois Confederacy when they grew up so they paid close attention.

What were the roles & responsibilities of Women in the Iroquois Confederacy?

Clan Mothers	Women
 Clan mothers were the oldest and most respected women in their clans. 	 All women other than the clan mothers participated in women's councils
 Responsible for the clan's welfare and for maintaining harmony and balance within clans and nations 	 They discussed issues and used consensus Participated in decision making for their nation
 They selected the Hoyenah (male leader of the Iroquois Confederacy). 	 They advised the clan mothers on issues
 Could replace the Hoyaneh if they didn't follow the clan mother's wishes 	 The Great Law of Peace gave the clan mother ownership of the chieftainship title. This means that clan mothers had
 Advised the Hoyaneh on issues 	the responsibility of selecting the chiefs
