Text-centered questions and ways students will engage with the text

Opening Activity:

In pairs, discuss <u>photos</u> slides 31 - 34 and how they contribute to your ability to visualize the events from chapter 17. Jot down your ideas and be prepared to share with the class.

Explicit Vocabulary Instruction:

- 1. Introduce each word with these student-friendly definitions.
 - a. Gnawing: bite at or nibble something persistently
- 2. Model how each word can be used in a sentence.
 - a. I could see the mouse **gnawing** the wire, trying to eat through it.
- 3. Vocabulary slide deck here.
- 4. Active practice:
 - a. How is it different to state that you gnawed food instead of chewed it?

Content Knowledge:

- **Symbol:** when an object, person, or idea in a text has an additional meaning beyond its literal one.
- Characterization: the techniques an author uses to build understanding of a character.

Shared Reading:

Pages 76-77 (stop after "That was really nice of you (77).")

- 1. Why does Viji feel "happiness and relief (77)?"
- 2. How does Rukku's release of the balloon connect to those feelings?
- 3. What might the balloon symbolize?

Independent Reading:

Pages 77-78 (stop at the end of the chapter)

4. Notice how differently Viji feels about money and what it implies about how she feels about the future.

Discuss:

- 5. How is Viji's perspective on spending different from Muthu's and Arul's?
- 6. How does this give us a deeper understanding of all the children and how they feel about their situation?
