This document is an abstract template for the Annual CNMS Summer Undergraduate Research Fest at UMBC. The specific formatting requirements for abstracts are online at <https://surf.umbc.edu>. The entire abstract should fit on one page with one-inch margins on all four sides and use 12-point Times New Roman font. The presenting author's name (student) should be underlined. The text should be left-aligned. Do not use italics. The presenting undergraduate author should be the first author, and the research mentor should be the last author. For shared/group presentations, each (and every) presenter should submit the Abstract Submission and Presenter Registration form with all co-presenter names, which can be listed in alphabetical order and underlined if equal effort was devoted to the project. Affiliations should be included for all authors/coauthors and noted using superscript numbers. Please double-check the formatting of the authors' names, and affiliations to avoid having the abstract returned for rewriting.

The abstract body goes in this section. The suggested content includes background, the research questions, approach, experiments, results, and conclusion. The abstract does not include figures or tables, which are presented in the poster or slides only. The entire abstract body should be written as one cohesive paragraph. Please check all spelling and grammar. There is a **300-word maximum** for the body of the abstract. Follow this format, and monitor the word count to avoid having the abstract returned for rewriting. Please check the Sample Abstract also available on the SURF website.

Mentors must confirm they have reviewed and approved the abstract with the understanding that the abstract and presentations will be posted to an online virtual platform for public view. Since this is a virtual, online conference, there are no other options. **The abstract submission deadline is July 18, 2025, 11:59pm.** Visit the SURF website at surf.umbc.edu for other details. Be sure to include an acknowledgement statement at the end recognizing funding support.
