Plan for this Year

- Aiming for ~50 people, most of whom have facilitated circles, plus some new community members from the Boston area.
- We have the option to do some site visits on Wednesday
- We could also do an extra introduction to learning circles for newbies (Wednesday)
- We have 4 rooms booked at BPL, which allows for a few different formats:
 - Large group: Sharing updates, stories, outcomes, questions facilitated by p2pu
 - Smaller breakouts: Led by participants and/or p2pu
 - Unconference/open space
 - + Social time
- We won't charge a registration fee: about 25 people are already sponsored through grants (IMLS and Toronto project); the rest won't be expected to cover anything more than food costs.

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- Other thoughts? Boston has a well-developed network of adult basic skills providers, most of whom know nothing about learning circles. Could they be invited to a newbies workshop and/or an introduction to learning circles?
 - Yes! These are the people we want to reach out to.
 - Great. Hold off for a few weeks until we get the Boston website up. But we will hope that you and Jordan/BPL can help us identify new Boston-area community partners. Sound good? Yes -- I haven't met Jordan yet but would like to.
- Other people who should be there?
 - Boston-area adult basic skills providers + BPL partners
 - Historically the BPL has been very active in offering computer training and digital literacy training courses, There have also been community computing centers. It might be possible to reach out to these folks.
 - Learning circle facilitators from R.I. and Maine, as well as from the three community-based organizations in Boston that were part of the English Now! Pilot project
- Wed: perhaps learning circle training is separate from thurs-fri?
