Dear NJHS Candidate and Family:

Membership in the National Junior Honor Society (NJHS) is one of the highest honors that can be awarded to a middle school student. Our chapter's goal is to bring the accomplishments of outstanding students to the attention of parents, teachers, peers, and the community. Our chapter strives to give practical meaning to the Society's standards of scholarship, service, leadership, character, and citizenship. These five ideals are considered as the basis for selection. No student is inducted simply because of a high academic average. The National Junior Honor Society strives to recognize the whole student—one who excels in all of these areas.

In order to apply, students must meet the following requirements:

- **Scholarship**: 85% cumulative average or higher (previous academic year)
- Leadership, service, character, and citizenship: as demonstrated by activities, behavior and two teacher evaluations (see attached).
- <u>Essay</u>: Brief essay on selected topic (see attached)

Membership, however, is more than an honor. It is an ongoing responsibility and an obligation to continue to demonstrate those outstanding qualities that result in a student's selection. Membership also carries a responsibility to the chapter. If our NJHS chapter is to be effective and meaningful, each member must become and stay involved.

Below is the list of chapter obligations each member is expected to uphold in order to obtain and maintain membership.

- Attend Meetings: After school, once per month
- **Dues:** \$20.00 due at first meeting after acceptance (one time fee)
- **Discipline**: No administrative discipline consequences
- Service hours: Minimum of 10 logged individual service hours and an additional group service project

Questions 1-4 request student identifying information

Question 5: Leadership Positions: List all elected or appointed leadership positions you have held in school, community, or work activities. Only those positions in which you were responsible for directing or motivating others should be included. Examples: elected officer for the student body, class, or club; committee chairperson; team captain; newspaper editor; work area manager; or other community leader. Please include the name of the adult responsible for supervising your leadership in each position.

Question 6: Service Activities: List service activities in which you have participated. These can be individual or group service projects done either in or out of school Generally speaking, service activities are those that are done for or on behalf of others (not including immediate family members) for which no compensation (monetary or other) has been given. Include adult supervisor contact information and also list the estimated number of hours you invested while performing this service.

Question 7: Student Activities: List all school-based activities (*not* noted above) in which you have participated in school. Include clubs, teams, musical groups, etc., and any significant accomplishments in each. In this section, you may also list other community activities in which you have participated and note any major accomplishment in each. These should be any activities outside of school in which you participated for the betterment of your community. For example, religious groups, clubs sponsored outside the school, Boy or Girl Scouts, community art endeavors, etc. Do not repeat participation already listed above. Please include the name and contact information of the adult supervisor of each activity.

Question 8: Work/Volunteer Hours: Though not a specific criterion for membership, please list below any job experiences, honors, or recognition you have received that support your candidacy for membership in the Honor Society. Work experience may be paid or volunteer. Include adult supervisor contact information.
