- The design team gave an overview of design inspiration

 - o New high schools in the region – Wahconah and Taconic
- Palate proposed – brick and stone colored metal panel, glazing, sunshades,
- New energy code limiting glazing to 20% - need to balance sunlight, architectural
- Window patterns to be reviewed at next meeting
- Feedback:
 - o Brian Kaplan:
 - Likes the approach of using materials already used in our communities
 - This is your entrance to Great Barrington – making sure this building has a presence
 - Recommend the piece popping out has its own identity with materials
 - Let's inspire students and choose modern materials
 - o Andrew Riley:

- Responded well to interior layout and separate bus stop
- Would ask the design team to take reference from monument mountain – the natural materials
- Would like to see a modern design
- Of a place, but inspiring of the outside world
- Recommended looking at shaker village for references
- Feels like the design should stand on its own, not be in all the same language as the elementary and middle school – red brick can be exciting in certain applications
- o Steve Shatz:
 - Cautioned the group on how we talk about the design taste, traditionalist vs. modernists, and make sure we appeal to both for voting success
- o Andrew would prefer a more controlled palette of materials
- o Williams Mount Greylock – included brick at entry way where it is most impactful (seatwall) - group agreed with the idea of using more expensive materials sparingly at impactful locations.
