¡Bienvenidos a la clase de español! Welcome to our Preparation for Advanced Spanish Summer class. We look forward to a fun way to review and develop skills that you will need at higher Spanish levels, such as IB or AP courses.

Course Description

This course builds on concepts and skills learned during the first 3 years of Spanish. It is designed to provide extensive practice in context and help students build speaking and written proficiency in the Spanish Language, in addition to gaining cultural awareness. Students can expect to read authentic texts from the media; listen to news broadcasts, videos and music from the Spanish-speaking world, and interact with each other in class discussions every day. Active participation will be very important.

Course Topics

- Vocabulary related to academic, literary and general knowledge topics: newspaper articles, description and discussion of people and experiences, shopping, describing feelings, nature and ecology, holidays and celebrations, careers, historic events, and responding verbally to conflict.
- Grammar review of conjugation and use in context of: preterit and imperfect tenses, future tense, conditional tense, present perfect tense, imperative mood, and subjunctive mood.
- Direct and indirect pronouns.
- Prepositions and transition words.
- Past participles as adjectives.
- Culture topics from the Spanish-speaking world.

A Pen or Pencil Notebook or paper Computer Internet access No textbook or workbook will be needed as the course work will be assigned from authentic materials from the Spanish-speaking world as well as OER's (Open Edicational Resources).
