Hilary

- Nursing research (undergrads)
- Activity on research vs. review articles
- Hands-on research support in class

Kate

- Mostly all she does
- Recent class - professor gave students pop articles on a topic, in class they looked at scholarly articles on the topic

Cecilia

- Works with professionals so not really the same kind of thing
- Has them write down questions/projects they've recently done, then does one live in class to help them see where to look

Ellen

- Mostly one-shots
- Nursing: freshman classes fall/spring, then again in junior year (for writing requirement)

- Time at end of class for hands-on
- Asks students questions as they go, especially in terms of keywords - asks them for topics and wings it (uses canned topics if they don't speak up)
- Poll Anywhere questions (such as how much library spends on resources)
- Human Boolean (doesn't call it that) - usually does it with clothes
- Index cards when they come in so they can ask questions - answers midway through session

Tess

- Mostly one-shot
- Has used Human Boolean
- Went to Learn How to Fish workshop at NNLM - they gave out a list of active learning activities - looks at this to get ideas
- Has used post-it notes activity as they leave for ending feedback
- Also has used post-its for which databases they've used
- Has also done the index card activity for "what you know & what you have questions about"

A'Llyn

- Doesn't teach much, but Education team will ask for topics in advance, then demo actual topics in class (but plans ahead)

New PubMed interface coming

- Check PubMed labs
- No date yet provided for go-live
- May run in parallel with old interface

Lit searches for faculty

- Systematic reviews - only with authorship
 - Tess, Kate, Amanda would/do searches & write methods but only for this situation
- Tess - will do a search and then hand off citations
- Kate - generally Tess's approach
- Tess had this assigned in a med librarianship class - do a sample systematic review, using CADTH
- Hilary/Ellen - within nursing use PRISMA

- Would need a more robust tool (like Covidence) for systematic reviews
- Otherwise most of the other options (RefWorks, Endnote, Zotero, Mendeley) are fine
