A	AUDIENCE: Who is the speaker/writer trying to reach? How do we know? Do they indicate a specific audience? What assumptions exist in the text about the intended audience?	
C	CONTEXT: What is the time and place of this piece? What is happening in the world as it relates to the subject of the speech or the speaker/writer?	
E C	EXIGENCE: What was the spark or catalyst that moved the speaker/writer to act/write? How did that event impact the speaker/writer?	
	CHOICES: What are the <u>the rhetorical choices</u> that the speaker/writer makes in the speech? Think about overall structure, devices, diction, syntax, etc.	
A	APPEALS: Which of the three rhetorical appeals (ethos, logos, pathos) are present in the text? Where? Why?	
T	<u>TONE:</u> <u>What is the speaker/author's attitude toward the subject? Is the tone the same throughout the whole piece?</u> Where does it shift? What evidence is there to demonstrate the tone?
