I plan to incorporate the following components in my Online Course:

Community Building: Using a Google Site, I will use tools to help develop a sense of community such as the Padlet, Google Jamboard, and videos. The teachers who are taking this course will be able to feel supported and connected.

Collaboration: I will include a variety of opportunities for collaboration, including team discussions, reflections, and a Google Doc for teachers to share ideas with each other. Teachers will be able to work together to discuss challenges that they

have encountered when working with English Language Learners and how to use UDL to support them.

Multimedia: The course will include multimedia components including YouTube Videos, Padlets, Google Jamboard, and other opportunities for instructions and learning.

Evaluation: Teachers will complete evaluations in the form of reflection and discussions via Google Forms, collaborative/shared Google Docs with UDL lesson plan ideas, and create/develop a UDL enhanced lesson plan at the end of the course.

Personalization: For the online course, teachers will be able to use which resources and strategies apply to their classroom and student needs specifically. I will provide a variety of tools to support them.

Synchronous Meeting: The online course will allow opportunities for a Weekly Chat using Google Meets every week, where teachers who are completing the course will meet to discuss the week's lessons and how they are applying UDL strategies in their classrooms.
