FAQ's	 What is a College/Academic Resume? a. A resume that lists yours achievements and activities from high school (and sometimes middle school) Why do I need one? a. Colleges and scholarship organizations want to know how you spend your time outside of class time. For example, playing a sport can demonstrate your dedication and passion even if your grades do not reflect those attributes. b. Most colleges request resumes via the Common App when you are applying; Most scholarship applications request resumes How is this different from other kinds of resumes? a. College/Academic resumes are DIFFERENT from resumes that you write to apply to jobs. Resumes for work list prior work experience (and sometimes relevant volunteer experience) whereas college/academic resumes are focused on multiple areas What are the most important parts of a resume? a. Consistent formatting!!!! b. Listing everything that you do outside of class time including if you are a caretaker for a member of your family, attend a church group, take photos, etc.
