3. **RULES FOR POOLS OF 3**

- Tris are best of 2 Games; 2 Sets to 25, must win by 2 pts. No Cap

- 12 sub rule – libero can be used - Volleyball Canada rules apply
- Placing at the end of the round robin will be determined as follows:
- The first criterion is by matches won.
- If two or more teams are tied at the end of the preliminary round, the following criteria will be applied, in order (VC rules):
 - I. The team having the best ratio of won/lost matches, considering matches between the tied teams, will be ranked higher;
 - II. The team having the best ratio of won/lost sets, considering matches played between the tied teams, will be ranked higher;
 - III. The team having the best ratio of won/lost sets, considering all matches of the round, will be ranked higher;
 - IV. The team having the best ratio of points for/against, considering sets played between the tied teams will be ranked higher;
 - V. The team having the best ratio of points for/against, considering all sets played during the round, will be ranked higher;
 - VI. As determined by the Organizing Committee (e.g. extra game, toss of coin, etc.)

When you apply this rule to break a tie you should follow this sequence:

 - a. When two teams are tied, the tie-breaking criteria are applied one after the other until the tie has been broken.
 - b. When three or more teams are tied, the tie-breaking criteria are applied one after the other until all the tied teams have been ranked.

NOTE: This means that if there is a tie among teams X, Y and Z and criteria II) can determine X as first, Y as second and Z as third, then no further criteria are to be used. The tie is broken. However, if criteria II) determines X as first and there is still a tie between Y and Z, then the ranking of the remaining teams will be determined by proceeding to criteria iii) and so on, if necessary. Do not start at criteria I) again. Continue through the sequence of criteria using the results of teams X, Y and Z for criteria IV).

- This tie breaking criteria can be found in the SHSAA handbook and on the SHSAA web site as well.
- Host schools must keep track of results.

4. **RULES FOR POOLS OF 4 AND POOLS OF 5**

- each match is 2 games only: Two games to 25 pts – win by 2 no cap
- 12 sub rule – libero can be used - Volleyball Canada rules apply
- The standings will be kept by keeping track of the number of sets won, not the number of matches. If 2 or more teams are tied in the total number of sets won – head to head record and then points for/against between the tied teams will be used to break the tie. If the teams are still tied then the total number of points for/against will be used as the final tiebreaker.
- Host schools must keep track of results.

5. **OFFICIALS**

- We will have SVO officials for preliminaries and for finals.
- We will try our best to have umpires for the semifinals and finals.
- Each host supplies 2 lines people for matches.
- Where lines people are not available please use players from each team.
- Each host needs to have two scorekeepers for each match.

6. **GATE** - Host School must set up a gate at preliminary tournaments.

- a. Adults - \$5.00
- b. Students (K - 12) - Free when a student card is presented
