Required Supplies:

- o Notebook or a 3-ring binder with paper (graph paper will be helpful)
- o pencil
- o your computer
- o scientific calculator or graphing calculator

Cell Phones:

At the beginning of class, it is an expectation that you will turn your phone off, or turn it on silent mode, and put it away. During assessments students will be required to “park” their cell phones, smart watches, etc. in a cell phone parking lot at the front of the classroom.

Bathroom Breaks:

If a student needs to leave the classroom to use the restroom, get water, etc., they must sign out on a sign-out sheet by the door and sign back in when they return. **Only one student will be permitted to leave the room at a time.**

Homework:

Homework is assigned to give students independent practice opportunities. It is expected that students will complete the assigned problems. Homework completion will be recorded in PowerSchool weekly, but will not count as part of the student’s grade. If a student feels they could use more practice beyond the problems assigned, the student should ask the teacher for additional problems in any standard they find challenging.

Extra Help:

I am generally available during block A and after school until 3:00. A link to my extra help schedule is posted on the Syllabus page on Canvas. Students do no need to email me to arrange for extra help, just check the calendar to see when I’m available and where you should meet me.

Math Lab:

The math lab is an additional resource for students who have questions about the math curriculum they are studying. Students are invited to attend when they have a directed research or free block and have questions about homework, assessments or concepts. The Math Lab is staffed every day during block A and also at certain times during the school day. The Math Lab is not staffed after school. A link to the Math Lab schedule is posted on the Syllabus page on Canvas.

If you are absent, please **check Canvas to find out what you missed**. All assignments are posted on Canvas. If there is a test or quiz given on a day you are absent you are expected to make it up the day of your return.
