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Manuscript preparation guidelines for the conference of the RSSJ (in English, 11 pt in bold)

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Abstract: This document provides guidelines for preparing manuscripts for the conference of the Remote Sensing Society of Japan. It describes the required format for titles, authors, affiliations, abstracts (limited to 100 words or fewer), main text, figures, tables, and references. Authors are requested to follow these guidelines to ensure a consistent format for the proceedings. Please read these guidelines carefully. Papers that significantly deviate from these guidelines will not be eligible for presentation at the conference. (9 pt)

Keywords: presentation, format, annual meeting. (9 pt)

1. Paper (Section title: 10 pt, bold)

A4-size white paper (21.0 cm × 29.7 cm) should be used in portrait orientation, with margins of 26 mm at the top and bottom and 21 mm on the left and right. Please prepare the manuscript using document editing software or equivalent. The total length should be either 2 or 4 pages. Use a Mincho-style font for Japanese text and a Times-style font for English text.

2. Title, Author Names, Affiliations

Titles, author names, and affiliations should be provided in both Japanese and English. For the single-column section, set the line spacing to a fixed value of 12 pt.

2.1 Title (11 pt, bold)

Center-align the Japanese title followed by the English title. In the English title, capitalize only the first letter and proper nouns; use lowercase for all other words.

2.2 Author Names and Affiliations (10 pt)

Place “○” before the name of the presenter and “*” before the name of the corresponding author, and center-align the names and affiliations. If the presenter is also the corresponding author, use “○*Name”.

For authors’ names in Japanese, Japanese authors may use kanji, while katakana is preferred for authors from outside Japan.

The title, author names, and affiliations stated at the beginning of the manuscript will be regarded as the correct information and published on the RSSJ website.

2.3 Contact Information for the Presenter and Corresponding Author (8 pt)

As shown in the example at the bottom left of the first page, provide the membership category, affiliation address, telephone number, and E-mail address following the “○” or “*” and name. Place this information below a horizontal line to distinguish it from the main text.

3. Abstract and Keywords (9 points)

The abstract should be limited to 100 words. After the

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abstract, provide several keywords, separated by commas. “**Abstract:**” and “**Keywords:**” should be in 9-point bold italic type.

4. Main Text (10 points)

The main text should be formatted in two columns, with approximately 50 characters per line (based on half-width characters) and 50 lines per column on each page. The text should be justified.

5. Figures and Tables

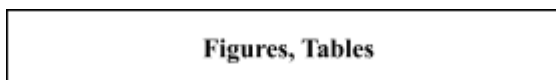


Fig. 1. Sample Image.

Figure and table numbers should be formatted as Fig. 1, Fig. 2, Table 1, Table 2, etc.

6. References

In the main text, indicate citations using superscript numbers followed by “)”, such as ¹⁾ or ²⁻⁴⁾. List all references together at the end of the manuscript.

Any citation style may be used; however, please use a commonly accepted citation style, such as ISO 690 or IEEE, and apply it consistently throughout the manuscript.
