We invite submissions concerning the following topics:

- ▶ Various periods when masculinity was in crisis, or not
- ▶ The meanings of masculinity, manhood, manliness, and/or crisis in the Middle Ages
- ▶ Social relationships, 'male bonding', hierarchies, and hegemony
- ▶ Inclusion/exclusion: the intersection of crisis and marginalized masculinities
- ▶ Development and circulation of gendered knowledge, e.g., texts and rhetoric concerning manhood, masculinity, manliness, and gender expectations
- ▶ How did crisis, like war or plague, shape or reshape normative masculinities? What manifestations of internal crisis are available to us as medievalists?
- ▶ Masculine expressions and definitions of crisis emotions
