The skill-building workshops are based on the needs of the community, designed to enhance the capacity of the community, specifically to enable communities to assess needs, identify resources, and make plans to be self-sustaining with a culture of cooperation. Emergency Response Capabilities:

Shelter and Safety: Provide a safe space for emergency shelter, including natural building models and sustainable housing solutions.

Food and Water Systems: Establish storage for dry goods and provide access to fresh water, ice, refrigeration, and a commercial kitchen. Implement rainwater catchment, grey water systems, and hydro-electric solutions.

Energy Generation and Storage: Deploy a Hybrid Resilience System (HyRS) combining solar PV, battery storage, and backup generators to ensure reliable power during outages.

Resource Distribution: Serve as a Community Point of Distribution (CPD) for packing and distributing goods, offering transportation for up to six weeks if needed.

Critical Communication: Equip the hub and community with Radio communication resources and other communication tools to keep the community informed and educated about hazards.

Community Resilience Building:

Educational Programming: Conduct a series of skill-building workshops, focusing on topics like sustainable living, food security, and leadership development. Workshops will be designed based on community needs identified through assessments.

Community Engagement: Host local events such as farmers markets, cultural activities, and events in a space designed for safe gathering and community-building.

Wellness: Health and vitality workshops, herbalism including herbal first aid, Integrate a community kitchen and garden for food production and space for health and wellness activities.

Mission: The Kona Resilience Center will establish a vital community resource in Kailua-Kona, Hawai'i, to address both immediate and long-term needs related to disaster resilience. Our program is designed to serve two primary functions:

- 1. Emergency Response: As a Resilience Hub, we will provide a safe space during emergencies by offering critical services such as shelter, resource distribution, communication, and essential supplies. We would like our facility to be equipped to handle a week's worth of dry goods storage, offer transportation during extended emergencies, and maintain a supply of freshwater, food, ice, medical supplies, and power. We would like to deploy a Hybrid Resilience System (HyRS) integrating solar power, energy storage, and backup generators to ensure continuous operation. Additionally, our hub plans to be equipped to provide internet access through Starlink to keep the community connected and communications strong.
- Community Resilience and Development: Beyond emergency response, the Kona Resilience Center will function as a community center fostering long-term resilience. We will support economic growth, leadership development, and skill-building through educational workshops and training programs. Our space would like to host local events,

farmers markets, and cultural activities, enriching community life, and facilitating connections.

Our leadership team & partners: With over 25 years of combined experience in community organizing and emergency management, includes experts such as Krista Arce, Chair of the Hawai'i Island VOAD, and Katrina Zavalney, Director of Aranya Solutions. Their expertise ensures effective disaster response and resilience-building efforts. We collaborate with local partners to enhance community preparedness and response such as Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (VOAD) for information related to emergency management. We are part of the Resilience Hub Network with the mission to build community skills to address vulnerabilities and enhance resilience island wide, where we are provided annual training and resources for emergency management and community resilience. We have a partnership with Parks and Rec where we can use their facilities for emergencies and community functions. Aranya Solutions, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, will operate the Kona Resilience Hub and provide a platform to receive donations to keep the center going.

The need for the Kona Resilience Center is underscored by recent events like the Lahaina fire, which highlighted the urgency for improved resilience hubs and communication networks. Our center will be executed in phases, beginning with identifying the needs in the community, securing a physical space and acquiring necessary equipment. Once operational, the center will serve as a catalyst for collective action towards a sustainable and resilient future, providing educational programs to meet the needs, making a lasting impact on our community's ability to thrive amidst challenges.

Nepal Agricultural Training

Improving lives of deprived communities in Dingam, Chipling and Thakani villages in Nepal.

Supporting the people in the Himalayas be more self-sustaining, empowering women and livelihood improvements through regenerative agriculture with shiitake mushroom and kiwi farming, beekeeping and leadership development. Aranya Solutions is working with three economically marginalized rural villages on strengthening their local capacities to improve their well-being and sustainability with a focus on indigenous sovereignty and cultural heritage preservation.

Aranya Solutions partnered with the local Rotary Club in Soroti, Central Uganda to implement a project that installed industrial grade solar cookers and planted a total of 3,300 fruit trees at three different school sites. These schools had been facing several problems associated with burning wood for cooking the new solar cookers help the health and reduce carbon!

Regenerative Land Use - with Starhawk

Aranya Solutions produced a fundraiser in March 2019 in Oakland for Starkawk's Earth Activist Training's new Regenerative Land Management Training Program to offer diversity scholarships for people from communities of color and low-income communities to attend the program. Aranya Solutions also helped in the development of this Regenerative Land Management Training Program, as well as providing mentorship to trainees.

Details:

We are working with mentors, land, farms and ranchers around the world for internship placement. We also help raise funds for diversity scholarships.

This new long term program (2 years) in Regenerative Agriculture and Land Management led by Starhawk, Charles Williams and many other guest speakers and mentors. It's based around two ten-day intensives, short internships, a longer-term apprenticeship and many shorter courses, all guided by a personal mentor who will help tailor the program to participants' goals and needs. Internship sites will be sought across North America and internationally, so that students can learn from a variety of enterprises, approaches and gain exposure to land management practices and challenges in different cultures. The goal is to develop pathways for more farmers, ranchers, organizers and businesses that are focused on regenerative land

management. 20-30 students per course, this new long-term program is designed to give the skills, experience and confidence to run a farm, ranch, retreat center or urban farm in ways that heal damaged ecosystems and sequester carbon. The student often become teachers and leaders who will pass this knowledge on.

Aranya Solutions collaborates with a web of partners, such as Rotary International and local partner organizations in each location to provide access to assets that bolster cultural resilience, sustainability and livelihood. We work internationally, often serving the underserved.

What Aranya Means

Aranya means "Abundant Forest" in Sanskrit. We have an ecological mindset in our approach, where we think and act like a forest ecosystem, identifying where the levers for support are needed and bring resources to fulfill the needs – pollinating like bee's creating a web of support systems.

Our Story

The inspiration for developing a nonprofit came during Katrina Zavalney's international travels in 2017 doing research on the international community development field. She wanted to do work aligned with sustainable land use and utilize her skills as a coordinator and community organizer. Aranya means "abundant forest" in Sanskrit, signifying plenitude, generosity, resourcefulness and prosperity. She recognized that her skills and network is full of resources that can be used to help coordinate people and lands to be self-sustaining and contribute to their larger communities' livelihoods.

Recognizing how hard it can be for start-ups to find the resources available, she began to envision Aranya Solutions as a nonprofit serving as a framework for organizational support for sustainable community development. Aranya Solutions provides education in administrative and organizational skills, and could become a forum to accept donations for scholarships and needs. We are collaboration-based, working in partnership with organizations and local institutions including schools, the Government and International Nongovernmental Organizations (INGO's). Katrina shared "As I talked with locals, it became clear that there is a need for smaller more agile organizational support with local-level projects. This is where Aranya Solutions fits, by understanding and being responsive to local needs by being a bridge to resources and organizational support."

The first project was identified in Nepal, Dingam Village, that fit our criteria and is a community in dire need where no other organization's were working, thus our impact will be significant. It quickly became apparent that we need to have our own nonprofit to properly coordinate the first and many more projects focused on community and sustainability development for long lasting sustainable solutions. We developed a calendar of activities to meet the needs of the village assessed for the next 4 years for agriculture, education, health, leadership and community development. Now is the time where we can create an organization to have tremendous impacts with people in need.

This nonprofit was formed to fill an important niche of working directly with the community in collaboration with local organizations and providing leadership development skills for long term public health and sustainability. The purpose of having a nonprofit in the USA is to raise funds from the States to bring to places that are in greater need, as a direct channel for fundraising efforts for maximum impact. Ethos is to serve the under served, starting our work in Nepal after seeing the needs for more support on the ground and fundraising. Aranya Solutions serves organizations and communities dedicated to making the world a better place. We create and facilitate strategies for efficiency.

In 2019 we took on more local and international projects related to regenerative agriculture working with Starhawk and Rotary International. As we are about creating an abundant forest it is very aligned with our mission to focus on regenerative practices.

In 2021 we moved to Hawaii to start a Sustainability Center as the Aranya Solutions Headquarters, where we can grow food year-round, provide educational workshops around resiliency, natural building, life skills, anything under the sun for regenerative and sustainable living, and community activities like dance, farmers market, and more. STARHAWK'S REGENERATIVE LAND MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

We are working with mentors, land, farms and ranchers around the world for internship placement. We also help raise funds for diversity scholarships.

This new long term program (2 years) in Regenerative Agriculture and Land Management led by Starhawk, Charles Williams and many other guest speakers and mentors. It's based around two ten-day intensives, short internships, a longer-term apprenticeship and many shorter courses, all guided by a personal mentor who will help tailor the program to participants' goals and needs. Internship sites will be sought across North America and internationally, so that students can learn from a variety of enterprises, approaches and gain exposure to land management practices and challenges in different cultures. The goal is to develop pathways for more farmers, ranchers, organizers and businesses that are focused on regenerative land management. 20-30 students per course, this new long-term program is designed to give the skills, experience and confidence to run a farm, ranch, retreat center or urban farm in ways that

heal damaged ecosystems and sequester carbon. The student often become teachers and leaders who will pass this knowledge on.

Improving lives of deprived communities in Dingam, Chipling and Thakani villages in Nepal - Empowering Women and Village Livelihood

Supporting the people in the Himalayas be more self-sustaining, empowering women and livelihood improvements through regenerative agriculture with shiitake mushroom and kiwi farming, beekeeping and leadership development. Aranya Solutions is working with three economically marginalized rural villages on strengthening their local capacities to improve their well-being and sustainability with a focus on indigenous sovereignty and cultural heritage preservation.

Partnering with the Institute for Cultural Affairs in Nepal (ICA-Nepal) and Rotary International, Aranya Solutions worked with three adjoining villages in the Nuwakot and Sindhupalchowk districts of Nepal starting in 2017 to implement a Village Livelihood Program. These two districts are among the most affected areas by the massive earthquake of 2015 in Nepal.

The major objective of the project is to enhance the leadership capacity of the communities for income generation of 200 households through skill development activities and diversify their agriculture in these deprived communities.

These rural villages are in the foothills of the Himalayas, 2,500 meters high in the mountains, 65 km from Kathmandu,capital of Nepal. These villages are connected with roads that are not accessible during rainy monsoon season.



Program Overview:

o **General Agriculture and Livelihood training** provided to diversify the agriculture, extend growing season, improve livestock raising techniques, mushroom farming, beekeeping and create value added products. Agriculture Demonstration Plots to aid in the infrastructure and sustainability of their agriculture program.

o **Micro Entreprise Development** – a Cooperative was initiated, with assistance from other successful programs and suggestions for income generation using local resources, such as honey production, a specialized sector will be for women's skill development.

o **Women empowerment** – counseling, safe place for women and their empowerment to explore new ideas and explore inherent capacities to lead. Handloom training for women participants to engage them into income generating activities including cooperative training.

o **Leadership Development** – We gave leadership trainings to the whole community and support network, local leaders in the villages, Rotary Community Corps, Elected Local Government Officials for identifying the resources, making plans and resource mobilization.



IMPACT:

By the end of 2019, the Village Livelihood Program had provided several trainings to people in the villages of Dingam, Chipling, Thankani–and **ultimately** *impacted* 10,000 people in the region.

The outcome is empowered communities to be self-sustaining. The impact is the well being of the community state of health and happiness, *afterall, isn't happiness the ultimate goal in life?*

Over 100 villagers were trained in sustainable agriculture, including shitake and kiwi farming, nursery management and tunnel house cultivation, and beekeeping and honey production. Outcomes were skills-sharing amongst villagers that enabled the training to reach 1,000 people and the diversification of agricultural products, which resulted in increased income from market sales.

Women's empowerment was promoted through training 60 women on traditional handloom weaving, which enabled women throughout the local villages to expand their craft sales at markets, while they bonded. Essential psychological and counseling support was also provided to ensure the training had a beneficial and long-lasting impact on women's economic development.

Training was also provided to 30 people in micro-enterprise development and to 24 people in leadership and governance, furthering the capacity of the villages to be self-sustaining. All the villages were also taught how to create a cooperative to combine their resources for continued success. **20 new enterprises were formed** with a support network of a coordinator and team for each new enterprise, and additional support from the village cooperative formed. Women's Empowerment through Weaving in Nepal



Look at the detail in this gorgeous bag! This was created in Nepal in our women's empowerment program, it's one example of many – including scarves, bags and shawls that 60 local women learned how to weave during our 45 day training program serving 3 villages.

Our executive director/founder, Katrina Zavalney had the honor of being in Nepal personally for this training. She experienced first-hand the joy these women received from learning these new skills to weave.

The course was part of a larger program to support local economies, enable families to stay together, and support communities to thrive through training in regenerative agriculture, leadership and to form a cooperative. Within one month, local stores began carrying these beautiful, handmade, local goods rather than only imported junk food, sodas and beer.

Until this point, only a small handful of women knew how to weave these traditional items; it was becoming a lost cultural skill. Beyond the initial 60 women directly impacted, an inspiring ripple effect reached neighboring villages reaching over 10,000 people.

This is truly a regenerative circular economy. Looms are made from locally available and sourced bamboo, providing further benefit to the local livelihood. They live in mountain jungles of Nepal, in remote villages our work encourages to be self-sustaining.

These women feel heard, seen and empowered to do more in their community. Aranya Solutions partners with ICA Nepal and Rotary International to find the best local teachers in Nepal. These women have a new element in their lives that enables them to express their creativity, and earn an income. In addition, they learn about their once-dying culture and history, and can now keep that alive and thriving.

Why Regenerative Land Management is Important - and how our founder, Katrina Zavalney, got involved...

A personal post, I wanted to share something of the heart. The reason why I am doing this event Regenerate on March 28th with Starhawk. This is much more than an event for me, it is synergies for something special, something needed – to spread the word about the need for more Regenerative Land Use and pathways to support careers happening in this field. Beyond careers, lifestyles. To support awareness of carbon sequestration and knowing how to work with and on the land and repair the earth, we are in dire need, and many people have lost connection and knowledge and the earth is going into catastrophe. I know in my family in just 2 generations there has been much knowledge lost where 2 generations back they used to live off the land, now we are modernized and don't know how as much. I wanted to create a platform for awareness raising and raising abundance so more people have access to the training and knowledge to do this work. I admire and support diversity scholarships, people who traditionally haven't had access due to unnecessary levels of oppression – we need to stop these cycles and uplift each other, so I am putting on a fundraiser. Starhawk and Earth Activists training created a program to bring back this knowledge and

create career and lifestyles in this – The Regenerative Land Management Training program. There are many other great programs as well out there on this topic, however I have a special connection to this particular one and delighted that it is ready to share! Here's more about how this program came into creation – and I am very lucky to have been part of it from the start.

I first got involved in this project 3 years ago, well – longer than that – but this particular track started with Starhawk 3 years ago, I think for her it has been a lifelong development J. It started with the International Permaculture convergence continuity after London of how to keep connected and what resources are needed at this time for the greater community. When Starhawk shared about this, I had to get involved – per a growing interest in both International development and the relation to sustainable agriculture and livelihood. Overtime this developed into a curriculum and program, and it was fun as I would explore the world, come back from my travels and touch base with Starhawk, and there were always synchronicities with where we were both at over the years and recognized land that was available for use. We saw a need to utilize and support these resources and determined that there would be an internship component to the program and that everyone should have the opportunity to learn from other cultures and practices by spending time on farms internationally. I knew if we were going to ask that of people we needed to have a way of supporting them financially, as it can be expensive to travel. This is one reason for holding a fundraiser.

Starhawk and I have been friends with for many years, and hold a special connection with as our lives have weaved together since 2005, have a lot of mutual friends, and we've helped each other out in many ways since we've known each other. I adore her spirit and what she

stands for and fully support her. I first met her when she was working on the Bayview Hunters Point garden project working with disadvantaged youth and teaching permaculture skills. Through that I met the magnificent Brandi Mack who has gone onto create amazing programs and promoting FarmHER's and skills shares and awesome sustainability lifestyles, and this woman has astounding positive energy it always brings me up! I have been inspired by and met so many people through this network. Then there is the spiritual community where I keep getting pulled into from friends in LA who would bring Starhawk in for rituals and gatherings and pull me into helping plan, even after I moved to the Bay! So that afforded Starhawk and I the opportunity to carpool/ road trip together, share stories of her time in Palestine and progressive movements, from anti-war to anti-nukes, she is deeply committed to bringing the techniques and creative power of spirituality to political activism. I just love her courage and tenacity, and keeping an even keel through it all. A true leader on so many levels – and a real person, and a real sense of humor – I love that woman's cackle! Our connection always had the key note of permaculture and climate change awareness and how to get it out to more people. So as this program developed over the years it had hopes to really get the much needed information out there that could be utilized into a long-term course of action and spread. This is why I stood by her and the development over the years, unpaid, and many hours poured into supporting the creation of a regenerative land management program. This is really her baby and I am simply a support unit.

I really see the need to support the financial development of this program and vision, and visionary – as Starhawk has not been paid for this creation either! She is a generous soul with so much knowledge to give and huge network of inspiring, knowledgeable teachers she in bringing in to share their wisdom in the program, like

her first permaculture teacher Penny Livingston, who is so experienced and wise! And as I mentioned we want to support people to explore regenerative land use and farming practices internationally, and that adds up. I know the fundraiser won't pay for it all, but it is a starting block and more so a tool to help raise awareness about this program and why it exists. I am hoping people will see this need and donate to the program, support Starhawk and diversity scholarships. I will continue to be available, support and be of service by attending the Regenerative Land Management training x program in May to get to know the participants and help them with their internship placements and structure to this portion of the program. Thus I am open to learning about farms and places around the world that participate in Regenerative practices and would like an intern for 2-6 months. Please let me know if you have or know of a viable place. I also will need funds to help support this program, so I am raising money to pay myself (finally) J and make sure we have a scholarship fund for the participants. This is how I work and I do it for the betterment of all.

I am also doing this in honor of our dear soul sister aManda Greene who just passed, and she has such a sweet connection to empowering youth and giving tools for success – she created the Youth Impact Hub to support the leadership of low-income youth of color in creating an equitable, life-affirming economy by providing socially innovative training, collaborative co-working space and access to networks and resources. I want these scholarships to go to people in this track. I want to support her vision and keep it going. We need more people like her and if she isn't around that means the responsibility is now with all of us. I take that to heart and will uphold

that for you my dear aManda, for all of us, and want all of us to do this together. So even if people can't make the event I want folks to know you can still support this program, career track and lifestyles in whatever way works for you – if you are in a financial place to support that is often what is needed most – however each person has their own unique gifts and talents and I ask you to utilize those and support our next generation and repair the earth, we need it, we need you, we need it now.

I also wanted to share more about why the entertainment was chosen for Regenerate on March 28th- that was very intentional as well. When I first got the call from Starhawk saying the program was ready, my first thought was "well need to have a fundraiser and get the word out!" And the next day I was a t New Years party and the Seastars were singing, they have such a sweet and fun way in singing about sustainability and harmonies and are incredible women who do this work outside of singing that it was a natural fit to have them sing. I told them about my excitement that the program was happening and they all love Starhawk, and she is the favorite author with the book the Fifth Sacred Thing, that it was meant to be and meaningful for all of us. Around the same time I saw my buddies from Hot Buttered Rum bluegrass band – whom I have known since college! They used to stay at our house when on tour in the Pacific Northwest in 2003/04! So we go way back - however this is the first time that we are doing a benefit concert together – we've talked about it and now here it is, so this is also very special and meaningful for all of us! Then my buddy Jonathan Youtt, who I've been wanting to do a show with him and his puppetry for years – has a great show about sustainable agriculture with the smallest farmer in America accompanied with a song and dance – one of my favorite characters ever!! Jonathan also started the PLACE for Sustainable Living and the Cell Space and is one of the most invested community organizers I've ever met, much respect and

love for this brother. And Neptune! A dear friend, Michael Gosney, introduced Neptune and I as he was taking Starhawk's permaculture course with the Earth Activists Training and asked if I would help steward his permaculture connections. Connecting people to resources is my favorite thing, especially people who care about permaculture and community – so I was ALL IN! Neptune is so inspired and on fire it is a joy to see this passion about Earth Activism! Neptune was available to DJ and support this event in this way with his talent and passion, so this was also meaningful. And let's not forget Starhawk, this is naturally a platform to share about the Regenerative Land Use program and why she developed it at this time. Also, one of my favorite things to do with her is the Spiral Dance so I had to find a venue big enough for a Spiral Dance, where we join hands and she spins us round and round and we get to look into each others eyes and celebrate as a community while singing and dancing, it is so fun!! So each act is very intentional and magical on how this came about. It is pure beauty and joy and everyone has been so supportive of this mission it makes my heart sing! Thank you!! I am so excited to play with you all and to see your talents in action!!

Thank you for taking the time to read and be with me, understand why I do this work and intention to build abundance to support those who want to step forward and repair the earth, those teachers who give us the information and tools to grow, and to Starhawk and her team who are creating the pathway to make this happen. Please join the support team with me and have some fun while at it! I hope to see you at the Regenerate fundraiser March 28th at Omni Commons in Oakland. For those who can't make it and will be out of town we will live stream some of it, and people can still contribute to the fund through my nonprofit www.AranyaSolutions.com and note that this is for the Starhawk Regenerative Land Management Program with Earth Activist Training.

Good friends of mine are aware of how I am constantly wondering how can I contribute to the world in a meaningful way that will bring impact. I hope this educational program will bring some impact through carbon sequestration and skills in how to work with and repair the earth – as we need to get back to it.
