the life and teachings of St. Paul	<ul> <li>Was a Roman citizen</li> <li>Saw a blinding light and converted to Christianity</li> <li>Traveled to Greece, Rome and Asia Minor to convert people to Christianity</li> <li>Built many churches</li> <li>Wrote letters to Christians</li> </ul>
the relationship of early Christians to officials of the Roman Empire	<ul> <li>Crucified Jesus</li> <li>Christians were persecuted - tossed into the Coliseum to face lions and gladiators</li> <li>Emperor Constantine spread Christianity after having a vision; he won the battle and thereafter supported Christianity</li> <li>Theodosius I outlawed pagan rituals</li> <li>By 380, Christianity was official religion of entire Roman Empire</li> </ul>
Holy Trinity	<ul> <li>God is the father/creator of world, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit</li> <li>Jesus was divine and human</li> <li>Holy Spirit is God's power on Earth that people feel/experience</li> </ul>
Resurrection and Salvation	<ul> <li>A strong central belief in Christianity         <ul> <li>Salvation is being free from sin</li> <li>God decides who gets everlasting life or Hell</li> <li>Anyone has faith Jesus and repents, can have everlasting life</li> </ul> </li> <li>Christ rose from the dead three days after his death on the cross</li> <li>The disciples went to spread the word of Jesus as Messiah</li> </ul>

Baptism	<ul> <li>Sacrament that gives one membership in Christianity</li> <li>Use water to symbolize the new phase in one's life</li> <li>Could be done as infant or later in life</li> </ul>
Holy Communion	<ul> <li>Sacrement</li> <li>Started with Last Supper</li> <li>Bread and wine/grape juice used to represent or symbolize the body and blood of Jesus</li> <li>The Eucharist represents the body</li> <li>Not every Christians celebrates Holy Communion or in the same way</li> </ul>
