Kylie vs Travis



In the ***International Court of Justice*** at The Hague, Netherlands, a notable legal dispute unfolded involving Kylie Jenner, the owner of the Badass Barbies, and Mr. Travis X, proprietor of the Hellfire Girls Clubs. This case centered around allegations brought by Jenner, the Plaintiff, against Travis X, the Defendant, concerning the improper acquisition of fighters from Jenner's Protected Practice Squad within the jurisdiction of the Unsanctioned Cage Combat (UCC).

Jenner filed this case after failed attempts by the UCC, the regulatory body overseeing both stables, to curb the unauthorized movement of fighters. With the UCC's jurisdiction having international scope and the Badass Barbies based in the US while Hellfire Girls Clubs operated from London, the Hague emerged as the fitting venue.

The litigation, blending aspects of international sports governance, intellectual property, and jurisdictional intricacies, now rests before the International Court of Justice. The outcome stands to influence not only the involved entities but also the broader landscape of international combat sports.



In a shrewd move, Kylie Jenner strategically assembled her legal representation, opting to engage the services of Attorney **Alan Shore**, who had previously proven his mettle by securing her victory in the Ageism case.

Conversely, Travis X adopted a less earnest approach to the case, designating his assistant, **Rachel**, to stand as his representative.



The proceedings will be presided over by the esteemed **Helle Thorning-Schmidt**, former Prime Minister of Denmark, who will serve as the presiding judge. Renowned for her no-nonsense approach, Judge Thorning-Schmidt demonstrates a proclivity for preparedness and strict adherence to protocol, and she is known to be impartial yet intolerant of those who fail to observe procedural norms.

The Bailiff administered the oath to both parties, officially initiating the legal protocol. As all parties assumed their seats, Judge Thorning-Schmidt entered the courtroom, prompting the commencement of the proceedings for case number CS1747399. The Judge delivered her introductory statements, signaling the formal commencement of the proceedings.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Order in the court. Next on the docket is the case of Kylie Jenner vs Hellfire Girls Club.

Bailiff. The parties have been sworn in your Honor.



Judge Thorning-Schmidt: We convene today to address a case centered around the emerging fighter, **Leni Olumi Klum**. The Plaintiffs assert that Leni's acquisition was carried out in contravention of legal regulations and that she held a protected status within their roster. Conversely, the Defendants contend that their actions were conducted within the boundaries of the law and that there was no infringement in procuring Leni's services. This court shall diligently examine the presented arguments and evidence to ascertain the veracity of these claims. We will now hear opening statements.

Opening Statements

Alan Shore: Thank you, Your Honor. We intend to demonstrate that Leni Olumi Klum held a significant position within the Badass Barbie Protected Practice Squad, and further, that her transfer to Travis X of the Hellfire Girls Club was an illicit acquisition.

Travis: (Interrupting) That's utterly preposterous.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: (Intervening) Silence, Mr. X. Your opportunity to present your case will come.

Travis: (Attempting to speak) But Kylie...

Rachel whispers in Travis's ear, prompting him to resume his seat.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Proceed council.

Alan Shore: Our objective is to establish the nullity of Leni's contract with Hellfire and advocate for her immediate release. Furthermore, we aim to present evidence of Travis's breach of UCC regulations through the solicitation of fighters from protected lists.

Travis, rising in frustration: Judge, these allegations are baseless! She's fabricating these alleged rules out of bitterness for losing out on Leni.



Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Travis, this serves as your final caution. Any additional disruptions will result in a charge of contempt of court.

Rachel intervenes, pacifying Travis: Your Honor, we apologize for the outburst. This unexpected development has caused heightened emotions and undue stress on my client. I assure you, there will be no further disturbances.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: I appreciate your cooperation, counsel.

Alan Shore: With your permission, Your Honor, may we proceed? **(Judge Thorning-Schmidt nods)**

Alan Shore: Our intention is to illustrate that other stables within the UCC adhere to the same regulations that Hellfire has violated. Furthermore, we aim to provide evidence establishing my client's exclusive rights to Leni Klum as an MMA fighter. Thank you, Your Honor.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: You may proceed, Mr. X.

Rachel, stepping forward from the defendants' table, closes her briefcase.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Are you an attorney, Ms. Rachel?

Rachel: Yes, Your Honor. I will be representing Mr. Travis X in these proceedings.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Go ahead with your opening statement.

Rachel: Thank you, Your Honor. Our objective is to demonstrate that Travis and the Hellfire Girls Club Stable legally entered into a rookie contract with Leni Klum. This practice has been consistent for over a decade within Hellfire, and all our contracts are legal and binding agreements. Throughout our history, there hasn't been a single instance of malfeasance or impropriety with any of our fighters. The Plaintiffs' claims lack validity and should be promptly dismissed, allowing Leni to resume her training.

Travis smiles at Rachel's opening statement and forcefully strikes the table with his hand. Judge Thorning-Schmidt raises her gaze at Travis, who quickly averts his eyes, avoiding her stare.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: We will adjourn until after lunch, at which point I will entertain the presentation of evidence.

Rachel: Your Honor, with respect, we were not apprised of any forthcoming evidence. We are entitled to reciprocal discovery and require adequate time to review any such evidence.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Understood. Kylie and her attorneys shall provide all pertinent evidence, and you shall be granted a 24-hour window. We are to reconvene tomorrow at 12:00 PM for the commencement of the hearing.

Rachel and her team were meticulously reviewing the presented evidence when Travis entered the room.

Travis: Are we in a good position here? I'm quite determined to keep Leni, especially with her mother being on board with us.

Rachel: Much of the evidence is indirect and based on hearsay. We're scrutinizing a few specific points, but I believe we're on solid ground unless there are further clashes with the judge.

Travis: This whole case seems to stem from Kylie's dissatisfaction with being outpaced. She can assert her claim to discovering Leni all she wants, but it's irrelevant now. Leni is firmly aligned with Hellfire.

As the case unfolds, it's evident that emotions and competitive dynamics are at play, underscoring the gravity of the legal confrontation.

The Evidence

As they entered the courtroom, Travis exuded a composed and professional demeanor, clad in an impeccably tailored \$3,000 suit. Rachel, equally polished, donned a business suit with a black skirt that elegantly split at the sides, showcasing her well-proportioned legs as she walked.

Bailiff: All parties have been duly sworn in, Your Honor.


Judge Thorning-Schmidt directed a stern gaze towards Kylie. "In this courtroom, we adhere to the rules, which includes adhering to discovery procedures. I trust I won't encounter any further unexpected developments today. Is that clear, Ms. Jenner?"

Kylie: Yes, Your Honor.

Judge: Excellent. Now, let us proceed.

Alan Shore: We request that Exhibit A be admitted into evidence.

Alan Shore holds up a printed document labeled "Unsanctioned Cage Combat Rules and Regulations," spanning 23 pages.



Alan Shore: On page 17, paragraph 2 of this document, it explicitly outlines that each UCC Stable is entitled to designate up to 5 fighters for their "Protected Practice Squad." These fighters are allowed to train with the designated stable. While not formally contracted, they are designated as "Protected" and may not be signed by any other stable without the written consent of the overseeing stable.

Furthermore, the document specifies that these 5 fighters are to be publicly acknowledged on the UCC forum or featured in the official UCC magazine, "TKO." Once a fighter becomes a part of the "Protected Practice Squad," this status is upheld for a period of 6 months, contingent upon regular updates in "TKO" or the forum to maintain their active status.

Rachel: Objection, Your Honor. We acknowledge the existence of these rules, but, to be entirely candid, they are not consistently upheld. The UCC and its predecessor the UMMA often allow stables to exercise a degree of self-regulation, which has historically functioned effectively until the signing of one of the most promising rookies in recent memory.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Are you suggesting that Hellfire Girls Club joined the UCC with established rules, only to then willfully disregard them at their discretion?

Rachel: Not at all, Your Honor. We adhere to the rules just like any other stable. It's just that the UCC rules, while outlined, lack robust enforcement mechanisms.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Why then bother to establish rules?

Rachel: Your Honor, this operates within an Underground League, and the regulatory framework can be somewhat ambiguous at times.

Alan Shore: Rules are established to be followed, not to be conveniently ignored based on one's preferences or intentions. This rule in question is explicit—each stable is granted the privilege of designating 5 fighters under protection. This provision serves as a contingency measure against severe injuries or unforeseen departures, akin to insuring a roster, much like other sports leagues such as the NFL employ with their Practice Squad.



Rachel: Pardon me, but I'm not well-versed in American football. Don't other teams have the opportunity to sign players from another team's Practice Squad?

Travis shouts out YES and nods in agreement getting another glare from Judge Thorning-Schmidt

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Your point?

Alan Shore: Perhaps that analogy isn't the most fitting, but the underlying concept is clear. These designated fighters are a form of insurance for the stable and the teams are compensated when a player is signed by an opposing team.

Rachel: We contend that Kylie is exploiting the Protected Practice Squad to prevent fighters from joining other stables. Her intention is not to sign any of them but to hoard them making them ineligible to others.

Alan Shore: Objection! My client has indeed signed multiple members from her Practice Squad. Elle Fanning and Madelaine Petsch are prime examples, both of whom trained extensively with the Barbies.

Rachel: Were Elle and Madelaine not both signed as Free Agents, after being poached off of your practice squad by other stables?

Alan Shore: Yes, that's an accurate statement.

Rachel: Your Honor, this simply underscores the lack of adherence to UCC rules.

Alan Shore: The stealing of fighters has transpired, and Kylie has previously threatened legal action. However, she's now reached a tipping point. Consider the substantial investment of time and resources she pours into training these fighters, only to have them illegally taken away by competing stables. Rules exist for a reason, Your Honor.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Is there any additional information regarding the Protected Practice Squad?

Alan Shore: Yes, your honor. The Strikeforce stable tried to promote Lily-Rose Depp to their active roster but was informed by UCC officials that Lily-Rose was already a member of an opposing stables practice squad. Strikeforce abided by those rules.



Alan Shore: **Jordyn Jones**, Joey King, Madelyn Cline, Kelli Berglund, Paris Berelc, and Olivia Rodrigo were all part of the Protected Practice Squad and are presently active members of the Badass Barbies. In each case, all requisite rules were meticulously followed.

Rachel: We formally requested the UCC to provide us with records of Kylie's so-called requests. However, they've informed us that they are currently dealing with a backlog and will not have the information until the following week. Are we expected to take Kylie's claims at face value, regarding her inclusion of Leni in this alleged Practice Squad? The potential exists for her to arbitrarily designate individuals, thereby obstructing the signing process across the UCC. Does that appear equitable?

Travis can barely contain himself as he feels that the case will soon be resolved.


Judge Thorning-Schmidt: These are pertinent questions. We shall deliberate on these matters moving forward. Please proceed.

Alan Shore: I kindly ask the court to direct your attention to Exhibit B, displayed on the screen. This marks the initial instance of Leni being acknowledged as a member of the Badass Barbie Practice Squad. The reference comes from TKO 025, dated October 2022.

Kylie: Settle down please. I'll take a few questions. Ariel.

Rachel: As you can see, it has been more than the stipulated 6-month duration, rendering Leni no longer under protection as per the rules and making her a legal member of Hellfire.

Travis, struggling to maintain his composure, attempts to contain his emotions.

Alan Shore: Exhibit C, sourced from TKO 026 (December 2022), and Exhibit D, from TKO 028 (April 2023), provide further substantiation. These records irrefutably demonstrate Kylie's adherence to protocol, consistently updating Leni's status.

Hellfire Girls Club: Will Travis Steal Your Women?



In the Hellfire Girls Club headquarters in London Travis X, Jennifer Connelly and Rachel continue to discuss the prospect of luring UCC fighters away from their current stables.

Mr X turned the thick envelope over in his hand. It was sealed with a wax seal. He broke the seal and began looking at the photographs.

"My God...Victoria is getting close to Selena Gomez!"

Rachel nodded, "Yes. It's quite the feat for her to spend time with Selena. A Nickelodeon star and a Disney star."

Alan Shore: This article outlines Travis's intent to "Steal" female fighters from other rosters, including multiple attempts to recruit members of the Badass Barbies. Some of these attempts came very close to fruition.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: These circumstances seem to reflect the nature of the competition within this league. The dynamics are undeniably challenging for all involved.



Alan Shore: Your Honor, it's essential to clarify that **Sydney Sweeney's** acquisition was executed through a trade agreement with the Wicked Queens. This trade was conducted fairly and turned out to be mutually beneficial for both stables. It's not accurate to depict Sydney's move as a "stealing" scenario. Kylie participated in a legitimate and equitable trade. The option to pursue a similar trade was open to Travis as well, however, his approach may not align with standard practices.

Rachel: Objection, Your Honor! Alleging that my client's methods lack integrity is baseless.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: But he did publish an article stating he would "steal" women from other stables.

Rachel: Your Honor, that is an idiomatic expression, not a literal intent. Travis isn't engaged in any illicit activities to "steal" individuals.


Alan Shore: Nevertheless, he is known to resort to extreme measures to achieve his goals.

Rachel: Oh, please! Kylie publicly compiles a list of potential signings, and she employs persuasive tactics to secure most of them. She dubs it "**Kylie's Wishlist**" and goes to great lengths to make it a reality.

Kylie's Wishlist

Kylie feels a strong sense of pride in her accomplishments and believes that her stable is one of the finest in the UCC. She is constantly striving for improvement and is always on the lookout for opportunities to enhance the Badass Barbies. If the right fighter were to become available, she would not hesitate to add them to her roster in order to further bolster her team's chances of success.

Kylie has a wishlist of fighters that she would love to add to her stable. Some of the more obvious choices on her list include Hunter King, Sydney Sweeney, Madelaine Petch, and Emily Ratajkowski. However, Kylie's list also includes some unconventional names such as **Dua Lipa**, **Ana de Armas**, and **Victoria Justice**. Kylie recognizes that these may be more difficult additions to make, but she is always willing to explore all potential options in order to continue improving her stable. All 3 fighters have "Barbie" written all over them



Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Is this not akin to Travis's strategy?

Rachel: Well, the approaches have their differences. Travis doesn't exhibit the same level of, shall we say, tenacity.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Are there any additional exhibits?

Alan Shore: No, Your Honor.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Now, what about the defendants?



Rachel: Yes, Your Honor. We aim to demonstrate that **Lili Reinhart**, and **Camila Mendes**, purported members of Kylie's Protected Squad at the same time as Leni, were signed by other stables without any apparent response from Kylie. Are we to believe that she simply allows other stables to poach her fighters repeatedly, without so much as a murmur? Yet, when my client signs Leni, it's treated as a catastrophe of apocalyptic proportions.

Alan Shore: It's crucial to note that The Lost Wildcats sought official permission from Kylie before signing Lili Reinhart. Kylie, despite the fact that Lili moved to a rival stable, graciously consented.

Similarly, Camila Mendes held private discussions with Kylie and conveyed the interest of a new stable, **The Radio Killers**, in signing her. Kylie granted her approval. This demonstrates that other stables conscientiously adhere to the rules, which indeed function effectively. There were no such negotiations with Leni.



Judge Thorning-Schmidt: If there are no further exhibits, I'd like to proceed to the witness testimony.

Rachel: We were not apprised of any witnesses. We require time to conduct interviews and prepare our defense.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: That's not a possibility at this point. I've already accommodated delays. Plaintiffs?

The Witnesses

Alan Shore: We would like to call Leni Klum to the stand.

Leni appears taken aback, her emotions evident, and she looks close to tears. Heidi offers comfort, and Leni takes a deep breath before taking the oath.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Ms. Klum. Your abilities seem to have attracted considerable interest from both stables. You must possess a lot of physical talents.

Leni: I guess so. I'm not entirely sure. I've never actually fought in a cage before.

Alan Shore: Leni, could you please specify the period during which you were a member of the Badass Barbie Protected Practice Squad?

Leni: I can't provide the exact duration, but it was around 10 months, I think.

Alan Shore: Did you find your time with them to be enjoyable?

Leni: Absolutely. I learned so much from Kylie and her staff. I didn't have any experience in fighting before, and they taught me everything. Kendall Jenner ended up being my mentor.

Alan Shore: How was your experience working with Kylie?

Leni: It was amazing. Kylie would come by often and watch me progress. She was always there, giving me advice and helping me improve.

Alan Shore: Would you characterize your time there as positive?

Leni: Yes, definitely. I was getting a bit impatient about not being called up, but Kylie assured me that it would happen when I was ready.



Alan Shore: Were you surprised when you were told that you'd be joining **Hellfire Girls Club**?

Leni: Oh, absolutely! When they signed my mom, I thought, wouldn't it be amazing to become the first mother-daughter duo to fight together? I was beyond thrilled.

Alan Shore: When did you find out about your move to Hellfire?

Leni: My mom told me. She was so excited that she was almost in tears.

Alan Shore: Did your mom know about your connection to the Badass Barbies?

Leni: While I wasn't officially a Badass Barbie, yes, my mom was aware. Moms seem to know everything about their daughters.

Alan Shore: Given that, is it plausible to think that Travis and his team, except for your mother, were unaware that you were training with the Badass Barbies?

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Refrain from asking the witness about others' thoughts.

Leni: I really can't speak for Travis or anyone else but I assumed that they would know.

Alan Shore: Did you find it a bit strange that you were signed by Hellfire without any word from Kylie?

Leni: Maybe a little. She was so involved in my training. But I was just so excited to have a chance to fight and to be with my mom—it was a dream come true.

Alan Shore: That will be all for my questions for Ms. Klum.

The Judge's focus shifts toward the defendants' side of the courtroom.



Rachel: We would like to call **Kylie Jenner** to the stand.

Kylie gasps and confers with her attorneys.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Miss Jenner, Miss Jenner.

Kylie: Just a moment, Ma'am.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: It's "Your Honor," and you will approach the stand immediately.

Kylie reluctantly makes her way to the stand and is sworn in.

Rachel: You might not be acquainted with me, but I am Rachel, Travis X's assistant.

Kylie: I recognize who you are, and I'm well aware of your role. You're practically running the show over at Hellfire.

Rachel: I appreciate that acknowledgment.

Kylie: It's evident that Travis would be lost without you and Jennifer.

Rachel realizes Kylie is attempting to delay by offering compliments.

Rachel: Kylie, when you add a fighter to your practice squad, is it primarily to enhance your stable's performance or to prevent talented potential fighters from joining other stables?

Kylie: The primary objective is to elevate the Badass Barbies. If you read my contributions to TKO, you'd understand that my foremost aim is the advancement of my stable. Naturally, if it deters a promising prospect from joining another roster, it's an additional benefit.

Rachel: How much genuine concern do you actually hold for your practice squad? You frequently alter it, with fighters entering and exiting based on your changing moods.

Alan Shore: Objection! The defense is implying that my client lacks concern for her stable.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Sustained. Counsel will keep the questions pertinent to the case.

Rachel: Right, your commitment to your practice squad is unquestionable. However, when you lose a fighter to another stable, you often remain silent. Yet, when my client lawfully signs Leni, you initiate a legal battle. Can you elucidate this discrepancy? Is there a particular reason for your actions against my client?

Kylie: No, I hold Travis in high regard. He's a prominent figure in the UCC, and his stable holds a remarkable reputation. He possesses an innate ability to identify talent and consistently position his stable at the forefront. I harbor no animosity towards Travis or Hellfire Girls Club.

Rachel: Then, why did you initiate this legal action over what could be seen as a minor rules infringement? Is it worth potentially staining your stable's reputation, Kylie?

Kylie: I sincerely doubt that this incident will tarnish anything. I'm simply growing weary of investing significant resources in training fighters, only to have another stable unlawfully acquire them.

Rachel: Leni was part of your squad for about 10 months. Do you believe you were leading her on? Was there ever a plan to sign her, or was it a ploy to prevent her from competing in the UCC?

Kylie: We thoroughly discussed this with Leni, as well as another protected fighter, Olivia Dunne. Leni and Livvy showed substantial promise, and we intended to promote them by year's end. A launch event was in preparation, complete with extensive articles set for publication in TKO.

The Future is Here

Leni and Livvy Promoted



Rachel: Did you really intend to promote Leni or were you passifying her?

Kylie: Absolutely. She wasn't quite prepared, but I believed she could have a significant impact in a few months' time. She and Livvy are extremely talented but still a bit raw.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Are you concluded, counsel?

Rachel: I have no further questions for this witness.

Alan Shore: We would like to call Travis X to the stand.

Travis, seemingly eager to conclude these proceedings, promptly rises from his seat and swiftly approaches the witness stand. After taking the oath, he gestures almost impatiently for the prosecution to proceed.

Alan Shore: Travis, are you a regular reader of TKO magazine?

Travis: Certainly, it's common practice in the industry.

Alan Shore: Do you diligently read all the articles?



Travis: I certainly peruse the Raccoon articles, but the magazine contains a substantial amount of content. I generally rely on my team to provide summaries.

Alan Shore: Do you ever review the contributions from the Badass Barbies?

Travis: Occasionally, but as I mentioned, my team typically handles that and briefs me on the pertinent points and to be perfectly blunt, Kylie tends to ramble on.

Alan Shore: Can you recall having read Kylie's wishlists?

Travis becomes more attentive at the mention of the wishlists.

Travis: Yes, indeed. She was attempting to steal a few of my fighters. That is her Modus operandi. Mention a fighter then do whatever it takes to obtain them. Quite simply, I'm sick of it.

Alan Shore: Did she manage to succeed in her endeavors?

Travis: I wouldn't allow any of my fighters to be taken by her.

Alan Shore: Can you confirm if she made attempts to snatch your fighters away?

Travis: To my knowledge, there were no such attempts.



Alan Shore: Was **Victoria Justice** included in that list?

Travis: Yes, Victoria was among the names. I was upset that Kylie was showing interest in recruiting Victoria. She was one of my top Featherweights.

Alan Shore: Did Kylie ultimately manage to acquire Victoria?

Travis: Yes, Victoria is now a member of the Badass Barbies.


Alan Shore: And could you please elaborate on the manner in which Kylie obtained Victoria?

Travis: A trade was arranged between Victoria and **Taylor Swift**.

Alan Shore: So, to clarify, Kylie placed Victoria on her wish list and then proceeded to complete a trade for her. In your assessment, would you consider this an act of "stealing" and considering the proximity of their rankings, would you term this trade as fair?

Travis: Yes, it's plausible to categorize it as a fair trade.

Alan Shore: If Kylie's intention were to maliciously exploit your stable, wouldn't it have been more advantageous for her to await Victoria's release and then recruit her as a free agent?



Travis: In theory, she could have pursued that route, but let's not forget that she managed to "steal" Sydney Sweeney! I'm still upset with that move.

Alan Shore: Wasn't Sydney at the very bottom of the Lightweight rankings? Do you know her ranking at the time of her signing?

Travis: I'm not entirely sure.

Alan Shore: Let me remind you then. She was ranked 557th, third from the bottom in the Lightweight category. Do you believe any type of trade involving such a low-ranked fighter could be considered a "steal"?

Rachel: Objection, Your Honor. This line of questioning seems irrelevant to the case.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Counsel, what is your point here?

Alan Shore: We are attempting to illustrate that our client doesn't engage in stealing fighters, unlike Travis who authored articles about stealing women.

Travis: Come on, that's just a figure of speech. I don't go around "stealing" women.

Alan Shore: Let's return to discussing TKO magazine. How frequently do you read TKO or access it on your phone?



Travis: I quickly browse through them when they're released. As I mentioned earlier, I rely on my team to provide me with details.

Alan Shore: So, your defense essentially hinges on your staff's alleged negligence for not discovering Leni's affiliation with the Badass Barbies.

Travis: I would never place blame on my staff.

Alan Shore: Someone must assume responsibility. Either you neglected to read those three posts, or your staff overlooked informing you.

Travis: You can't genuinely expect anyone to meticulously review all of Kylie's writings. She tends to be quite verbose, much like this trial.

Alan Shore: "Advice of Counsel" cannot serve as a valid excuse. Such a defense might be suitable for political leaders who incite insurrections or employ their power to shield their son's wrongdoings. Nevertheless, not being aware of the rules is just as damning as intentionally breaking them.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: If there are no further witnesses then I will take a recess and make my decision. Court is adjourned.

The litigants rise as the Judge makes her way to her chambers, neither side is sure on which way she will rule. It only takes the Judge 15 minutes to render her decision and both parties scramble to get back into the Courthouse.

The Decision

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: I have carefully considered all the evidence and arguments presented in this case. It is evident that there have been disputes regarding the interpretation and adherence to the rules of the Unsanctioned Cage Combat league. While both sides have provided compelling perspectives, it is my duty to evaluate the facts and apply the relevant rules to the situation.

Travis, you have maintained that the practice of maintaining a "Protected Practice Squad" is not consistently upheld by all stables, and that the league's rules can be somewhat ambiguous. Nevertheless, the rules do exist to ensure fair play and to prevent undue poaching of fighters. It is clear that Leni Olumi Klum was indeed a member of the Badass Barbie Protected Practice Squad for a substantial period.

Kylie, you have demonstrated your commitment to your stable's growth and development through careful recruitment and training. Your actions in acquiring fighters for the Badass Barbies have been strategic and within the confines of the rules.

Considering the evidence presented and the arguments made, it is my decision that the recruitment of Leni Klum by Hellfire Girls Club was in violation of the established rules of the league. While the rules may not have been enforced uniformly in the past, this case highlights the necessity for consistency in maintaining a level playing field for all stables. The Protected Practice Squad rule is in place to ensure that fighters have a fair chance to develop their skills within their initial stables before being pursued by others.

Therefore, I rule in favor of the Plaintiffs and order that **Leni Olumi Klum** be released from her contract with Hellfire Girls Club and returned to the Badass Barbie Protected Practice Squad. I also encourage the league's governing body to consider enforcing the rules more consistently in the future to prevent such disputes from arising.

Travis is beside himself and vehemently rejects the Judge's ruling.

Travis: Your Honor, this is absolutely outrageous. I entered into a legally binding contract with Leni, and she is already an integral part of Hellfire Girls Club. There's no way she'll be a part of any other stable, period. I have **BIG** plans for Leni!

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Very well. In light of that, Kylie will be granted compensation. Ms. Jenner, if you are to receive compensation for Leni, who from the Hellfire roster would you like in exchange?



Kylie: Your Honor, I request to receive my sister **Kim Kardashian** as compensation.

Travis: This is beyond absurd! Kim is a cornerstone of Hellfire, and there's no way she'll ever leave. I'd sooner consider shutting the entire stable down than let a stalwart like Kim work for the likes of Kylie.


Judge Thorning-Schmidt: However, by doing so, wouldn't Kim become a free agent, potentially open to signing with Kylie or another stable?

Travis: Fine, let's disregard that suggestion. Hellfire won't be closing its doors, but I'll ensure that Kim remains an unwavering member as long as I'm at the helm.

Rachel: What my client is trying to convey is that Kim Kardashian holds a pivotal role within Hellfire Girls Club, and he would take all necessary measures to ensure she remains with the stable.

Alan Shore: So, Kim Kardashian's contract wasn't at risk during the **"Queen of the Castle"** event, where all of the Hellfire Girls Club members sought to gain a contract by ringing a bell in the attic after starting from the basement and fighting their way up?

Travis: That scenario was entirely different. It was a competition where survival of the fittest prevailed. I had complete confidence that Kim would succeed.



Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Wait a minute. Are they suggesting you'd have let Kim, the cornerstone or your organization, go if she had failed to ring the bell?

Travis: This is preposterous. I'm not relinquishing Kim. Never! Kim isn't going anywhere nor is Leni!

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Kylie, is there any other member of Hellfire Girls Club you'd consider as compensation?



Kylie: Yes, your Honor. I request **Emily Ratajkowski** as compensation for Leni Klum.

Travis raises his arms in frustration. The judge pounds her gavel.

Judge Thorning-Schmidt: Very well, then. Hellfire Girls Club is to either return Leni Klum to the Badass Barbies or provide Emily Ratajkowski as compensation. Court is adjourned!

Bailiff: All rise!

The courtroom erupts into chaos as Kylie and her team jubilantly celebrate, their cheers echoing off the walls. Some members of the Badass Barbies' entourage exchange triumphant glances while others pat each other on the back. On the other side, Travis slams his fist on the table, his face flushed with a mixture of disbelief and anger. Leni, overwhelmed by the tension, breaks down into tears, her emotions getting the best of her. Heidi Klum rushes over to her daughter, attempting to console her while casting accusatory glares towards Kylie.

As the noise level escalates, chaos reigns. Heidi's shouts compete with the cheers of Kylie's team, and the courtroom seems to have turned into a battleground of emotions. The judge pounds her gavel repeatedly, trying to restore order, but her attempts are mostly in vain.

Meanwhile, reporters seated in the gallery seize the opportunity, raising their voices to shout questions at Travis. "Mr. X, how do you feel about the verdict?" "Travis, are you considering giving up Emily?" "When will Leni make her debut?"



Amid the turmoil, Rachel quickly takes charge, her professional demeanor intact despite the shocking outcome. She gestures for Travis to follow her, guiding him out of the courtroom through the chaos. The stunned expression on Travis's face is evident as he's led away, his mind undoubtedly racing with the implications of the judge's decision as he rambles on about how much he has always hated the Danes.

Amid the courtroom commotion, Kylie remains standing, her triumphant smile juxtaposed against the unfolding bedlam. She holds her ground as reporters push for answers. "Kylie! Kylie! With 8 fighters now, where does Emily fit at Lightweight? Will Livvy still be promoted?" Their questions barrage her, momentarily chipping at her confidence. Nevertheless, in the midst of the onslaught, she manages to maintain her composure, prepared to navigate the storm of inquiries following her victory.

Gradually, the judge's gavel strikes with more determination, and her voice cuts through the noise. "Order! Order in the court!" The repeated calls for order start to have an effect as the chaos gradually subsides. Kylie's team begins to realize the need to quiet down, though their exaltation remains evident.

As the courtroom finally regains a semblance of order, Kylie makes her way out, walking through the judge's chambers as a more peaceful atmosphere takes over.
