

Oral Presentations

The total time allocation for each oral presentation is 7 minutes and then the author will participate in a joint Q and A with other presenters in the session immediately after the presentation of that block of Oral Presentations. The presentation can be given in-person, or virtually live. A primary author is required and a presenter is required.

Please note: Individuals may present a maximum of two oral presentations. This includes papers presented on behalf of first authors who are unable to attend the meeting.

Template (maximum of 400-word abstracts accepted)

Title: no more than 20 words

Objective: provide a brief introductory statement about the issue at hand followed by the specific objectives. State the main study questions and identify any hypotheses being tested.

Design: state the study type, e.g. randomised controlled trial, systematic review, cost-benefit analysis, retrospective cohort study, etc.

Method: describe the participants (report age as mean (SD) in years and months; sex as 'n=' (not %); relevant classification/s; recruitment method), instrumentation and measures (use SI units, except for blood pressure use mmHg, convert imperial units to metric), procedure and statistical analyses used.

Results: identify the main study outcomes including results of any statistical tests (show standard deviations as (SD), not \pm ; do not use percentages for sample sizes below 50; abbreviate probability with a lower-case p). Please note that it is not sufficient to state that 'results will be presented'.

Conclusion: state conclusions as clinical implications and future research directions.

Presentation's alignment with Oceania Academy Equity Statement: please specify how the presentation addresses principles outlined in the Oceania Academy Equity Statement. This will NOT be included in the 400-word count.

References: if necessary, a maximum of 3 references will be accepted, but will be included in your 400-word count.

Figures and tables: are not permitted.

Additional Information: additional information such as acknowledgements may be included but will be included in the 400-word count.
