What is Super Global?

Our nonprofit <u>community</u> of creative and technology agencies is committed to enabling social problem solvers to revolutionise their impact through technology.

As their <u>tech copilot</u> we help them to formulate ideas, bring on the right expertise and build successful <u>partnerships</u> with our members.

Why do we need ambassadors?

As the name suggests Super Global is an international community. The point is to capture and share learnings across the network so that we grow our collective understanding in order to:

- Overhaul creative & tech agencies' ability to work effectively with social organisations.
- Turbocharge social organisations' ability to spot opportunities to use technology and the methods for doing so, including working with creative & tech agencies.

Since we're a nonprofit we can't afford to hire people in all the places where Super Global members and partners live, or where digital social innovation is happening. That's a lot of missed opportunities to learn!

This <u>network model</u> shows how the ambassador role can support our initiatives to help social problem solvers' learn about technology, and to help them form coalitions for joint problem solving and co-investment in innovation and tech.

Why should I be an ambassador?

We can't pay ambassadors but there are some great benefits:

- 1. Learn about social problems and meet the amazing organisations working to solve them.
- 2. Form meaningful connections with and learn from brilliant, socially minded agencies.
- 3. Play a vital bridging role between the social and agency communities to accelerate the global tech-for-good movement.
- 4. Co-create a network of pioneers with diverse experiences to learn from.
- 5. Help shape Super Global's future direction and priorities.

Technology ambassadors

You have experience running or working on digital projects and want to understand and improve the way that this expertise is applied to solving social problems.

Impact ambassadors

You have experience running or working on social projects and you want to understand and improve the way that technology expertise is applied to solving social problems.

What will I do as an ambassador?

- 1. Represent Super Global at events
 - a. Tech-for-good events inc. awards, meetups, hacks
 - b. Creative & tech agency land events
- 2. Produce content to share learnings with the community
 - a. Written articles
 - b. Short video interviews
- 3. Grow the network
 - a. Introduce new agencies to the community
 - b. Connect Super Global with social organisations
 - c. Spark relationships with relevant funders/accelerators/labs/networks
