

The Bill of Rights of Londinium

The colony of Londinium, under the leadership of the Senntisten Empire, ensures to of each and every citizen, resident, and visitor the intrinsic rights of:

1. The Right to settle within Londinium
2. The Right to buy and sell goods within the ward of Commercium
3. The Right to buy and sell land within Commercium and Domus
4. The Right to pearl a visitor of the town, if that individual has active claims upon them
5. The Right to transit within Londinium's territory.
6. The Right to express oneself.
7. The Right to refuse unreasonable searches and seizures of property unless a warrant is issued by the Justice of Londinium.

Once someone has purchased land, they shall become a Resident of Londinium. Every Resident and Citizen shall be granted the rights of:

1. The Right to purchase an additional plot of land within Domus
2. The Right to emigrate from the Colony of Londinium
3. The Right to be appointed to a position in the government

Once someone has been a full-time Resident of Londinium for one week or more, they shall become a Citizen of Londinium, and therefore of the Senntisten Empire. Within the Colony, they shall be granted the additional rights of:

1. The Right to propose laws to the House of Wards
2. The Right to vote on, but not amend laws passed by the house of Wards within the House of Commons
3. The Right to propose that an alderman be impeached by the house of Commons.

We hold these truths to be self-evident. The government in charge of the Colony of Londinium, whomever may lead it, as well as the Senntisten Empire must enforce these rights with swift and absolute justice. Anyone found violating the rights of another within the jurisdiction of the Colony of Londinium will be prosecuted in front of the Senntisten Court, and will face a minimum of a week of End time if found guilty of their crimes.

Should there be a case of national emergency (Extreme threat of raiders, hostile foreign identities, rogue government officials, etc.), the King of Senntisten has executive power over the leader of the Colony of Londinium. In this time of crisis, the King may issue decrees that affect the Colony of Londinium without opposition, so long as they coincide with the Bill of Rights of Londinium. These executive orders may be overturned if $\frac{3}{4}$ of the Ministers of Senntisten vote to, and the Leader of the Colony of Londinium agrees with the Ministers.

With the ratification of the Bill of Rights of Londinium, these rights and rules shall go into immediate effect, and must be enforced. With ratification, this document may never be repealed, but it may be amended. May favor shine brightly on Londinium and the Empire.
