This project aims to better understand the use of computer simulation of classrooms and the lesson planning process.

You will be asked to complete a short survey before and after the course on what you think about the use of computer simulations of classrooms. Data from your lesson simulations during tutorials and submitted lesson plans would also be used in the study.

While all students will complete simulations and lesson planning as part of their course, participation in the research component (i.e. the pre- and post-course surveys and use of simulation data and lesson plans) is optional.

Your decision to participate or not will have no impact upon your course or relationship with your lecturer or Griffith University, and you may withdraw your consent at any time without comment or penalty.

There are no anticipated risks associated with the research.

Your name will not be used in any research arising from this study and all data will be de-identified after the course. No individuals data will be reported, only averages for the cohort as a whole.

All research data (survey responses, simulator and lesson plan data, and analysis) will be retained in a password protected electronic file at Griffith University for a period of five years before being destroyed.

At the conclusion of the research project, the project website will be made publicly available and you will be able to view all de-identified research data along with the research publications arising from the project. While you will not be able to identify your own data, you will be able to see how your course as a whole views the use of computer simulations of lessons. This data will be made publicly available for use by future research.

It is expected that this research will benefit your lecturer to better understand the effectiveness of their teaching and more generally contribute to an improved understanding of the use of computer simulations in initial teacher education.
