Tennessee officials will execute an inmate today. Judges sentenced Lee Hall to death row after killing his ex girlfriend Traci Crozier in 1991. United States District Court officials appealed for a delay in the execution due to newly discovered evidence. Governor Bill Lee denied the appeal stating that he will not intervene in the rulings the judgement and sentence stand on. After Halls' execution, Tennessee will be the second state in modern history to execute a blind man.

Slug: Pearl Harbor Shooting

2 Navy sailors are dead after an active shooter stormed Pearl Harbor. The incident happened Wednesday afternoon after a U-S sailor unleashed fire in the shipyard. The shooter shot himself dead before officials could get to him. The altercation happened a mile away from the U.S Arizona memorial, but the shooting affected tourists as well. Tourists were placed under a shelter in place lockdown for 2 hours. Many tourists were in the Pearl Harbor area getting ready to observe the seventy-eighth anniversary of the Pearl Harbor attack. The U-S Department of Defense is currently investigating the situation. Governor David Ige (EE-GEH) says the White House is offering assistance due to the shooting. In a statement, Ige says “I join in solidarity with the people of Hawaii as we express our heartbreak over this tragedy and concern for those affected by the shooting.” Navy officials plan to release the shooter’s name and the victims’ names after all the families are notified. This is still a developing story.

Over seven hundred thousand SNAP recipients will lose access to food stamps soon. The Trump administration added a requirement for recipients to work. The rule change impacts childless recipients from eighteen to forty-nine. States were able to create waivers for high unemployment areas if a recipient could not meet the work requirement. Now, the USDA is restricting the use of waivers to only areas that have a six percent employment rate or higher. In Tennessee alone, sixty nine thousand recipients are in danger of losing their benefits.
