DBC Report – Holly Garin

- Not too much to report, but we are finalizing the budget
 - o We purchased three promethean boards and are confirming they've arrived
 - o Sometimes the discovery teachers use curriculum that the district doesn't pay for, so they are fundraising to help cover that

Principal Report – Katie Lynch

- We need to give feedback on the DAC Calendar(link will be included on the powerpoint presentation)
 - We need to have 173 Student Contact Days
 - We also have 185 Techer Contract Days
- Please put in comments/email Katie on which start date you would prefer her to send for our SAC vote
 - Keep in mind that if you choose a later school year start date then the students would be getting out later for the summer
 - We will also be able to vote on the Spring and Fall breaks(options are included in link provided in chat/paperwork passed out at in-person)
 - Vote was made by all attendee's and not just SAC voting members
 - Motion was made to include feedback to not have a full first week and to possibly start on Wednesday
 - Feedback will need to be gathered by September so we can get it to the board by October
- **CMAS and I-Ready tests** Erin Lehnert
 - We aren't able to release the test results just yet, but we will have them ready for a future meeting (released to public in late August)

- Slide to show the correlation between CMAS and i-Ready
 - CMAS starts at third grade
 - I-Ready starts at kindergarten to help them get ready to take online tests
 - CMAS Fixed form test
 - I-Ready Adaptive Form test
- I-Ready Data (Last year)
 - From beginning of the year
 - We have 13% of the students was at risk
 - 34% of students that were at grade level
 - 53% of students were at or above grade level
 - There hasn't been too much overflow effects from our COVID year
 - From End of the year
 - We moved from 13% to only 5% for at risk!!
 - We moved from 34% to 12% for students at grade level
 - We moved from 53% to 83% to at or above grade level!!
 - This has been a huge growth due to our heavy focus on learning at the school

• Teaching and Learning Conditions Colorado (TLCC)

- Teacher and learning conditions in Colorado
- Every school must give it and have 50% or higher
- Areas that it covers
 - New Staff questions
 - School leadership
 - Staff leadership
 - Managing student conduct
- Currently we have a 90% favorability (Link is in title for further information for Northridge Elementary Data)
